Moose Cite Lodge Member for Heroism

Members of Torrance Moose Lodge 785 honored one of their members for his heroism in ceremonies in the Moose Home at 1744 W. Carson St.

Joseph Leone was presented a plaque and acclaimed for his heroism by Bernard Finke after which he received a long round of applause and praise from all his Moose brothers and co-workers of the Women of the Moose.

On March 5, while working on a construction job in Torrance, Leone looked up from the truck he was standing on to see a fellow worker falling from the top of the building under con-

struction. Through quick action and driven by a love for his fellow man, Leone thrust his arms out and upward and cushioned the fall of Arthur Falcon saving him from almost certain death on the masonry work below.

Falcon received first aid treatment and went home while Leone was hospitalized with cuts and bruises and severe leg and knee injuries. After five days in the hospital he was released and spent many days in bed followed by several weeks of confinement to a wheel chair furnished to him by his Moose Lodge. At this time, four months after saving his co-workers life, Leone is

still on crutches and will be for many weeks to come.

Joseph and Patricia Ann Leone have one girl, Mary, 15 and five boys, Carl 13, Paul 11, Joseph Jr. 9, James 8, and Benny 6. The family lives at 2511 W. Alondra Boulevard in Compton.

A childhood friend of Mrs. Leone, Mrs. George Clay, first reported the Leone story to The Press. Mrs. Clay is a member of the college of Regents Degree of the Women of the Moose. It was through Mrs. Clay that the Leones were introduced to the Loyol Order of Moose and both became active members of the Family Fraternity.

HOME KEEPS LEADERSHIP IN TOTAL ASSETS





Bandshell Concert Sunday

Among the many special summer events scheduled by the Torrance Recreation Department for the entertainment of the community will be a concert by the North High School senior band at the Recreation Center Friday evening.

Directed by North High band teacher Robert L. Jones, 60 students will gain continuing experience in public performance as they play a variety of band selections, including several marches. Other numbers will include "The Poet and Peasant Overture," a medley from "The Music Man," and novelty numbers from the "Kiddie Ballet Suite." Some Latin American music will be featured, including the popular "Cha Cha for Band."

Some of the selection will be played under the baton of student-director Mike Dominguez, a senior at North High and the band's drum major and vice president.

The North High band has earned many honors in the past few years. In 1961 it marched in the Rose Parade, and later in the year it won the Mayor's Trophy in the Armed Forces Day parade in Torrance.

It performed before regional television cameras at the USC homecoming festi-

ties in 1962. For the past three years the band has won excellent ratings at district and regional competition festivals.

On Sept. 17 the band will perform as representatives of Torrance on Torrance Day at the Los Angeles County Fair at Pomona.

Jones, a graduate of Notre Dame, earned his master's degree at USC. In 1956 he traveled abroad with the Fred Waring group, and in 1961 he conducted the Western Los Angeles band. He has been at North High for four years.

Other musical events scheduled in the recreation department's summer program will include regular Sunday programs at the Torrance Park bandshell.

Among these will be featured an all-day performance by the South Bay Chapter of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America (the SPEBSQSA) on Aug. 4. A citywide combined-parks concert, in conjunction with the recreation department's "Fun Thru Music" program, is scheduled for Aug. 25 at the bandshell. On Aug. 9 and 10 the annual aquacade will be presented at the Benstead Plunge.
