Wing Re-elected Chairman of Hi-Shear; Directors Stay

Hi-Shear Corp., 20-year-old designer and producer of fastening systems, recently held its annual meeting of stockholders at the company's Torrance offices.

Stockholders voted unanimously to re-elect the following to serve as directors: George S. Wing (chairman), Allen J. Kirk, Albert E. Anderson, Guy Nash and William Halpern. All present directors are officers of the company.

Stockholders also approved a resolution to allow the directors to adjust stock prices in line with the current market values of the company's common shares. Hi-Shear's president, George S. Wing, told stockholders that sales and earnings prospects for the current fiscal year were very good, and he released the following preliminary unaudited results: For the four-month period ended June 30, 1963, net earnings were \$209,500, or \$0.41 per common share (based on 515,340 shares outstanding), as compared with a deficit of \$7,400, equal to \$0.01 per share (based on 518,340 shares) for the same four-month period a year ago. Net sales for the current four months rose from \$2,692,500 up from \$1,885,800 recorded during the like period in the previous year.

Wing pointed out that the backlog of orders for Hi-Shear's ordnance products was continuing to rise, and that "across the board" increases in sales could be expected during the balance of the current fiscal year.

Pfc. J. Mitchell Trains in Korea

Marine PFC James Mitchell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Mitchell of 1557 W. 220th St., is serving with the Third Battalion of the Third Marine Division, a unit which recently participated in a joint U.S. - Republic of Korea amphibious exercise dubbed "Operation Flagpole" and conducted near Seoul, Korea.

The training exercise involved 67 ships plus numerous Marine air and ground units of both nations.

It ended June 28 as U.S. and Korean Marines secured their last objectives after four days' shore combat amid driving rain.

"Flagpole" consisted of a mock invasion force gaining limited control of parts of the Republic of Korea and requiring action by American and Korean forces to destroy the enemy and restore governmental control.

HI-SHEAR GETS OK IN MARTIN UNIT INSPECTION

Hi-Shear Corp. was visited here July 12 by a process audit team from Martin Co., Denver. The team was led by J. G. Anderson, senior procurement agent, for the Titan missile. Other members of the team were H. M. Stein, senior test engineer; R. L. Savage, quality assurance auditor; K. D. Walther, quality control engineer; T. E. Topka, industrial engineer; R. M. Pesick, design engineer.

Hi-Shear is the designer and producer of 1 1/4 inch separation nuts used in the Titan II launch hold-down system. Other Hi-Shear products in the Titan missile series are stage separation hardware, Hi-Shear rivets, and blind press nuts.

The process audit team inspected and reviewed the manufacturing, engineering, test, and inspection facilities. They also reviewed the various processes and procedures utilized in producing Titan components. The review was a part of the continuing "zero defects" program maintained by the Martin Co. with its sub-contractors.

The visit presented Hi-Shear ordnance-manufacturing and engineering department heads an opportunity to resolve any questions and become better acquainted with Martin requirements and procurement procedures.

Such communication and liaison has resulted in Hi-Shear winning the Martin "T-Minus-10" citation in January, 1963. The award was given for quality and cost reduction performance. Hi-Shear was top on a list of 18 companies cited from over 4,000 vendors supplying components to the Titan program.
