Carson-Vt. Signals to Be Modernized

An allocation of \$2,500 was authorized this week to modernize traffic signals at the Carson Street-Vermont Avenue intersection, reports Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

The projects will consist of installing an impact detector at the Carson street west approach.

In addition, detector conduit will be installed at the Vermont south approach in back of new curb recently constructed adjacent to Harbor General Hospital.

The supervisor pointed out that the signal modification will provide increased traffic safety for both pedestrians and motorists going to and from the new hospital.

Hahn noted Carson Street and Vermont Avenue are both major highways carrying a daily average of 30,000 vehicles through their intersection.

"The completed installations will increase traffic safety and improve the regulation of traffic flow in this important area," Hahn said.
