

**LARGEST SLOOP** — Yacht Dynamics, Harbor City, is building this all-aluminum 73-foot auxiliary sloop, the largest in the United States, for west coast sportsman John B. Kilroy. Ribs, deck beams, and other aluminum shapes for the offshore racing boat, named the Kialoa II, are being produced by Harvey Aluminum, Torrance.

## WOODEN-HULL YACHTS BOW TO ALUMINUM

Aluminum boats are getting bigger. An all-aluminum 73-foot sloop, the largest in the United States, is under construction in Southern California for west coast sportsman John B. Kilroy. Designed by Sparkman and Stephens, Inc., New York, the offshore racing boat is being built by Yacht Dynamics at its Harbor City yard. The big racing auxiliary, named the Kialoa II, will be launched the first of next year to compete in the Aca-pulco and other international races.

"The Kialoa II," said Kenneth Watts, president of Yacht Dynamics, "has been lofted mathematically on a computer. We hope this boat will be able to go through the water a little better and faster than a comparable wooden boat."

The Class A boat will weigh 96,000 pounds. It will have a 14 foot-11 inch beam, 2700 square feet of sail area, accommodations for a crew of 16, and auxiliary power from an aluminum GM 4-53 130 hp. diesel. Aluminum shapes and special developmental sections for the racing sloop are being produced by Harvey Aluminum.

"Cost-wise," said Watts, "we believe aluminum boats can be built cheaper than boats out of wood. The value of a boat like Kilroy's Kialoa II 20 years from now will be worth a lot more than the money paid for it."

"An aluminum boat will not get what we call tired. After thirty years of use, it will be just as rigid and strong as it is today. A wooden boat has a tendency to get sort of lax or hog-back, just like a chair. It requires greater upkeep and takes on a musty odor in a few years."

Principals associated with Watts in Yacht Dynamics are Donald Douglas, Jr. and D. W. Gardiner. The Kialoa II will be based at Newport Harbor Yacht Club.


Thornton, a member of Headquarters Company of the 8th Aviation Battalion in Germany, entered the Army in December, 1962, and completed basic training at Fort Ord.
