





**SEAHAWK GRIDDERS  
TO START PRACTICE**

Football coach Floyd "Scrappy" Rhea of Harbor College today issued a call for all Seahawk gridders to report to practice at 9:30 Tuesday morning, Sept. 3. Uniforms will be issued and physical examinations will be conducted on that date. Two-a-day workouts are scheduled through Sept. 12. On Sept. 13, the week-end before school starts, the Seahawks will hold their first scrimmage against Citrus on the Citrus field.

On Sept. 20, the Seahawks will scrimmage against the nation's best when they drill with Long Beach City. Harbor plays its first practice game against San Diego City College Sept. 28 on the Harbor field. Western State Conference action starts on Saturday, Oct. 19, in a night game at Pierce.

In his first season as head coach, Rhea hopes to move the Hawks well up in the conference standings. He will stress weight lifting and body building in his conditioning routines.

**Bob Hogle Seeks to Widen  
Lead Over Sprint Car Foes**

Bob Hogle of Buena Park will be trying to lengthen his lead in the fight for the 1963 California Acing Assn. (CRA) Sprint Car driving championship, when he meets 35 of the fastest big car drivers in the West, in this Wednesday night's eight-event racing program at Ascot Park. Racing starts at 8:30 p.m., with time trials beginning at 7 p.m.

Hogle who has scored five main event wins already this year, has a 264-point lead over his nearest competitor, Dee Jones of Bellflower. Hogle is trying to add his name to the list of famous drivers that have worn the coveted championship. These include Troy Ruttman, Bob Denny, George Seeger, Harry Stockman, Nick Valenta, Jack Gardner, Roy Prosser, Art Bisch, Chuck Hulse, Don Davis, Jack Brunner, and Colby Scroggins.

Hogle's closest challengers are Jones with 461½ points to Hogle's 725½, and Allen Heath of Northridge with 447½. All three will be out to win the final prep for the annual 100-lap Labor Day night race on Sept. 2.

Two other drivers who are fast closing on the leaders are Bob McCoy of San Diego in fifth place with 328½, and Don Melton of San Bernardino, in sixth position with 250. McCoy has scored three big wins at Ascot in the last month, with Melton still searching for his first big car win in the powerful Offy powered car owned by Bruce Bromme of Gardena.

Wednesday night's race will feature a 30-lap main event for the fastest 14 qualifiers on the one-half mile clay oval. Other racing includes a 15-lap semimain, four 6-lap heat races, and a 3-lap trophy dash.

Gardena's Ben Steele, shut out for four straight weeks, as he tried to add to his point lead in the fight for the 1963 Figure 8 Stock Car racing championship, will put the point lead on the line when he takes on the largest field of the year in Monday's special Labor Day 100-lap Figure 8 Stock Car racing championship at Ascot Park, 183rd St. at So. Vermont Ave., where racing starts at 2 p.m., preceded by time trials at 1 p.m.

A field of more than 50 cars and drivers will start the Labor Day holiday event on the tricky criss-cross circuit, where drivers cross each others path twice a lap in front of the stands.

**Ben Steele Hoping to End  
String of Shutouts at Four**

Steele, driving a Chevie, will be after his fourth main event win of the year in the 100-lap feature that pays \$500 to win the race. The largest purse of the season to be split up among the first ten finishers in the added distance race. The longest race ever run by the figure-eighters has been 15 laps.

The number two driver in points is San Pedro's Bib Hobbs, who will be driving a Chevie in the 100-lap race. Steele has 1260 points; Hobbs 890.

Number three driver is Joe Drew of Lawndale in a Ford with 780 points. Drew goes after his third win of the year.

**Lakers Taking Long Look  
at Five Rookies in Camp**

The Los Angeles Lakers began their first activity of the coming season when they opened a week-long rookie camp at Loyola University. The club is eyeing its main draft choices in two-a-day sessions under tutelage of Fred Schaus.

Slated to show their wares in an attempt to make the club will be three Little All-America selections, an all-league choice from the Missouri Valley Conference and the Big 6 scoring champ of last year. Roger Strickland, 6-5, with a 32-point average and Little All-America honors at Jacksonville University, Jim King, 6-2, all-conference star from Tulsa, and 6-3, Mel Gibson, who led his Western Carolina College team to the NAIA finals while landing on the Little All-American team, are the club's first three draft choices. All will be trying to crash the Laker back-court.

A sleeper in the group could be 6-4 Warren Salade from Westminster College of Pennsylvania, also a

Little All-American choice, whose club twice reached the NAIA (Small-College) semi-finals during his first two years there.

Gordon Martin, the 6-7 shooting phenom from USC will also be on hand. Gordie led the "Big Six" in scoring last year.

Schaus will drill the rookie daily in afternoon sessions, then will stage informal scrimmages each evening, in company with many of the Laker veterans who are available.

"This is the 3rd year we've held an early rookie camp," said general manager Lou Mohs, "and it has proved beneficial to both our club and to the boys involved. If a rookie has no chance to make the NBA, we tell him so early enough that he has time to make other arrangements for himself. Meanwhile, when we go to regular training camp in September, we will have only the top candidates to look at."

The Lakers open their home schedule this year Oct. 30 against Cincinnati.
