

## Enrollment Up in Local Schools in L. A. System

2-34—ENROLLMENT UP  
Extensive planning is under way this week as the Los Angeles City School System—the nation's second largest—prepares to receive more than 745,000 students during the 1963-64 school year, which begins on Monday, Sept. 16.

Figures announced this week by Superintendent of Schools Jack P. Crowther indicate the present record enrollment of 716,294, which was reached by the district last February, will be broken by a considerable margin, probably in October, and then again next February.

Enrollment estimates for the new school year indicate 593,000 children and more than 155,000 adults will converge on the 594 schools operated by the Los Angeles system. This includes 425 elementary schools, 69 junior highs, 53 senior high schools, 27 adult schools, seven junior colleges, and 13 schools for handicapped students.

The superintendent said the district is now winding up preparations to accommodate the increased school population. This includes the opening of three new schools, completion of scores of new classrooms at existing schools, and transfer of portable bungalows to many locations where overcrowding is expected.

**HALF DAY SESSIONS**  
"When school closed last June, we had more than 14,000 young people on half-day sessions and these may increase during the coming school year," Crowther said.

A breakdown of the enrollment estimates for the fall semester shows 355,122 are expected for elementary grades, including approximately 51,000 kindergarten; 122,973 in junior high; and 115,742 in senior high schools.

Additionally, the district's seven junior colleges are anticipating a day and evening attendance of 69,662, and 86,057 pupils are expected to attend adult schools throughout the area.

Students attending Los Angeles City Schools during the coming year face an added three days in the classroom.

The 1963-64 school calendar, approved by the City Board of Education, calls for an 87-day fall semester and a 93-day spring semester, for a total of 180 days. The fall semester will end on Friday, January 31 and the spring semester will begin on Tuesday, February 4, and end on Friday, June 19.

**MID-SEMESTER BREAK**  
For the first time the calendar provides a pupil-free work day for teachers between semesters on Monday, February 3, 1964. Elementary, junior and senior high schools will be closed that day allowing faculties to prepare textbooks and classroom materials for the following semester. Colleges and evening high schools, however, will remain in session on that day.

Christmas vacation will run from Thursday, Dec. 19, through Wednesday, Jan. 1. The semester will resume on Thursday, January 2.

Other holidays include Veterans Day, Monday, November 11; Thanksgiving, Thursday and Friday, November 28 and 29; Lincoln's birthday, February 12; and Easter vacation, March 23 through March 27.

Washington's birthday and Memorial Day will not be school holidays this year.

**ENROLLMENT UP**  
Enrollment in local schools in Los Angeles City School System will be up this fall with two notable exceptions. Exceptions are Wilmington Park School, which anticipates a drop from 1119 students to 1078 students, and Banning High School, Wilmington, which is expected to zoom down from 3219 students last November to 1870 students when classes begin next week.

Expected enrollments of the Torrance schools, which are all up, are as follows: Bonita Street Elementary, 1127; Caroldale Avenue Elementary, 736; Carson Street Elementary, 1180; Del Amo Elementary, 687; Halldale Avenue Elementary, 922; 223rd Street Elementary, 1520; Van Deene Avenue Elementary, 1100; and White Junior High School, 2374, and Carson High School, 1834.

Also anticipating an increase in enrollment are: Dolores Street Elementary, Wilmington, 1104; Gulf Avenue Elementary, Wilmington, 1106; Harbor City Elementary, Harbor City, 956; Hawaiian Avenue Elementary, Wilmington, 1179; Lomita Elementary, 1144; Normont Elementary, Harbor City, 674; 259th Place Elementary, Lomita, 918; 232nd Place, Wilmington, 785; Wilmington Park Elementary, 1078; Fleming Junior High, Lomita, 1831, and Wilmington Junior High, Wilmington, 2509. Banning Adult School expects 2080 students.

**NARBONNE PRE-ENROLLMENT**  
Pupils expecting to attend Narbonne High School must pre-enroll in classes according to the following schedule:

Tuesday, September 10: A-11, B-12, and A-12 students, 8:30 to 12; Wednesday, September 11: B-11, A-10 students, 8:30 to 12; Thursday, September 12: B-10 students, 8:30 to 10; and Thursday, September 12: Any grade level not previously registered, 11 to 12.

Students are to report at the scheduled time. The registration will be handled in the auditorium, where department chairmen and counselors will be able to assist the students in securing their classes for the fall semester. All students must be appropriately dressed for school in order to enroll.

Pupils desiring sixth period athletics, school service, or leadership, are to bring their copy of the Spring, 1963, final report card with them for eligibility verification.

New students to the district, including all B-10 enrollees, should register on the day and hour of their specific class registration time, reporting to room C-5, before going to the auditorium.

State regulations prohibit any student being enrolled whose polio immunization record has not been filed with the school. Students who were in attendance at Narbonne in the spring and had not completed their polio inoculations must bring verification of inoculations with them at the time of pre-enrollment.
