

Gospel Concerts Set for Sept. 13, 14

Almost overnight gospel music has become one of the nation's most popular forms of entertainment. From the "tent meetings" to the great auditoriums of America, the audience no longer brings a basket to "spread dinner on the ground" but they come to tap their feet, clap their hands and sing along and enjoy themselves.

On Friday and Saturday nights, Sept. 13 and 14, at the Long Beach Municipal Auditorium, gospel music will be presented in concert. Headlining the spectacular program will be the nation's most popular gospel quartets, the sensational Statesmen Quartet from Atlanta, Georgia, the world-famous Blackwood Bros. from Memphis, Tenn., America's first family of gospel music, the Speer Family from Nashville, Tenn., and California's own Golden State Quartet

from Long Beach. The concert is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. and will last until midnight.

The international music publication, Billboard, recently heralded to the rather "blase" music industry that great changes had come about in the musical tastes of America, proclaiming that folk and gospel music had taken their places at the head of the trend. These two musical forms offer startling parallels. Both stem from the roots of our culture and beliefs. Their lyrics almost invariably of better things to come. The religious of our culture have long derived strength and solace and something to "hold on to" from gospel songs. Now, the youth of America are turning more and more to both gospel and folk music for the same things, according to Billboard.
