L.A. Varsity Candidates Turn Out for Practice

Upwards of 2800 varsity football candidates are expected to turn out for opening of fall practice at 45 Los Angeles city high schools next Tuesday morning, Sept. 10.

Two new schools, both of which were opened last February, will be fielding grid teams for the first time. The two fledgling institutions are Carson High of Wilmington in the Marine League and Chatsworth High in the West Valley League.

Physical examinations and issuance of equipment will be the first order of business Tuesday and then coaches and athletes will be out on the practice field for two workouts a day through Saturday, Sept. 14. The fall semester begins Monday, Sept. 16, and practice will then revert to after school drills.

Inter-school scrimmages have been scheduled by nearly all of the city schools for Friday, 20, and first games will be held on the following Friday, Sept. 27.

Five new head coaches will make their debut Tuesday and two "veteran" coaches will be embarking on tenures at new locations.

The two re-located coaches are Johnny Trump, moving from University to Chatsworth, and Gene Vollnogie, transferring from Banning to Carson.

Ray McLean, who assisted Jim Cheffers for six years at Roosevelt, was head coach at North Hollywood one season, and had the Bees back at Roosevelt last year, moves up to varsity headman since Cheffers was appointed as consultant to L.A. City Schools Supervisor of Athletics Guy Winkle.

Bob Hivner, former South Gate High, Compton College, and Washington University quarterback star, assumes the No. 1 post at South Gate. Hivner was an assistant at Fullerton High last year. Joe Seminario wound up a highly-successful coaching career at South Gate last fall and is now registrar at Palisades High.

Duane LaRue, who was assistant to Trump at University last year, is head coach at that school.

John Farhood, former assistant at Wils on and Verdugo Hills, is head coach at the latter, replacing Bill Davidson who transferred to Chatsworth.

Art Mazmanian, after seven years as Bee coach and winner of the league championship last year, will coach Dorsey, following in the footsteps of Bill Lauermann who was the Dons' head coach for 12 years.

Two Fastest Midget Drivers to Meet In Friday Night Race

Two of the fastest midget drivers on the West Coast, NMRA point leader Skip Edwards of Long Beach and track record-holder Frank Allen of Torrance, face each other next Friday night in the NMRA midget races at South Gate Raceway.

They can expect a tough battle with NMRA point runner-up Jack DeArmond of West Covina, who has been running very strong all year, and with 20-year-old Mike Hale, the youngest midget driver now racing, who won his first main event two weeks ago.

Edwards and DeArmond have been the most consistent main event winners this year, with DeArmond having jumped from fifth place in the point standings to his present position since June, and he now is within striking distance of first place.

Bob Castle of Orange, third in the point standings and only recently displaced from the second spot by DeArmond, also will be racing next Friday.

A total of about 30 midget drivers will be competing in the events, which begin with qualifying at 7 p.m., followed by the trophy dash, heat races, semi-main and main races, starting at 8:15 p.m.
