






Post Office Saluted

Postmaster Clara A. Conner said today she had received a letter from William H. Neal, National Director of the U.S. Savings Bonds Division, commending the local post office for its successful efforts in promoting the sale of U.S. Savings Stamps and announcing that children buying their first stamps of the school year will be given a free certificate signed by the seven Mercury Astronauts, designating them as "Junior Astronauts." These certificates are now available at the Post Office.

"Just as the good service rendered by post office is all-important to the success of school savings, so is the leadership of postmasters a source of encouragement to teachers, parents, pupils, and the many volunteers who participate in this patriotic thrift program," Mr. Neal wrote. "From your past performance," he added, "I know you will wish to continue your help in stimulating the interest of all these groups, thereby encouraging more schools to participate in the program in the months ahead."

given this program over the past twenty-three years, and offer my wishes for future success in the thrift services provided so ably by you to your community and your nation."

In her own endorsement, Postmaster Clara A. Conner said: "Selling Savings Stamps through the schools and over-the-counter to the public is a part of the Post Office Department's services of which we are particularly proud. The Treasury-sponsored School Savings Program not only promotes practical thrift but also acquaints our young people with their government and their duties and privileges as American citizens.
