

Disaster Program Set At Red Cross

When disasters strike, and major disasters occur at the rate of one every 24 hours, there is no time to plan an adequate information program.

Red Cross locally as a part of its preparedness program, will feature its disaster service at the Thursday, Oct. 10, meeting of the Torrance-Lomita Red Cross branch board of directors.

Allen Quignon, volunteer branch for the disaster service, has arranged the program and invited Ed Russell, an expert disaster staff member with Red Cross, to

be guest speaker. All interested persons are invited to the meeting which will be held at Branch Red Cross headquarters, 1617 Cabrillo Ave., beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Mrs. Mary Pagac, branch chairman, asks that attendance be confirmed by calling Red Cross, FA 8-0510.


"With Red Cross being obligated through its Congressional charter" . . . to continue and carry on a system of national and international relief in time of peace and apply the same to mitigating the sufferings


