**Nine Coeds Face Electorate On El Camino College Campus**

Nine El Camino College coeds will face an all-male electorate in the campus selection of the 1963 Grid Queen Oct. 3 and 4.

While the Associated Students make their choice of candidates to represent them in class and other student posts, the Associated Men Students will cast ballots to designate their top three choices for grid royalty.

Although the trio will be identified shortly following elections, the name of the queen, herself, will be withheld until the evening of the annual Grid Dance, Oct. 11. Runner-ups will be designated as princesses.

In charge of the dance and coronation proceedings is Sonny Cox, Los Angeles, president of the Associated Men Students.

Coeds vying for the grid queen honors will be presented to the Associated Students with other candidates for office at an election scheduled for the Campus Center steps at 11 a.m., Oct. 3.

Escorted by AMS officers, the queen and her attendants will reign during pre and between-half ceremonies of the El Camino-Cerritos football game in Mudd Stadium, Oct. 12.

Each of the eleven candidates boast a grade point average of 2.0 or better and a present academic load of at least 12 units.

**Montgomery Sr. Semi-Finalist**

John F. Webb, Bishop Montgomery High School senior, was named this week as Semi-Finalist in the National Merit Scholarship competitions.

The award places Webb among 13,000 seniors throughout the country who attained semi-finalist rank. The competitions were held in more than 16,500 high schools in fifty states and the territories.

National Merit Scholarship officials pointed out that almost all semi-finalists will win the rank of finalist. They need only to substantiate their qualifying test performance with comparable SAT test scores when the college entrance board tests are given this winter, be endorsed by their schools and fulfill certain routine requirements.

Merit scholars are selected from the finalist group. Last year, NMSC and sponsors together awarded about 1,500 scholarships.

Each Merit scholar will receive a four-year award to cover undergraduate years at the college of his choice.
