Library Movies Will Double Due to Public Response

Public interest and response to the motion picture shows presented by the Los Angeles County Public Library as one of its many public service features were so enthusiastic last year they will be doubled this year, according to County Librarian William S. Geller.

Beginning this month and continuing through June the library will present two regular monthly programs, one for children and one for adults, in a specified number of the libraries in the system. Last year only one regular monthly program was given.

Libraries that comprise the juvenile film circuit include the main Torrance City Library at 1345 Post Avenue.

The shows on both circuits will occur on varying dates each month, so would-

be attendees are urged to check at the library for exact date and program of each event.

All of the bills will be double or triple features, and all are open to all members of the public, but since seating space is limited the audience, necessarily, must be restricted to a first-come basis.

Films to be shown are part of the library's permanent collection, many are in color, all are new, and each will be available for borrowing after its initial public presentation.

Thirty-two new films have been ordered since July 1. Librarian Geller said, and fourteen have already arrived.

Last year the library's film shows played to a total audience of 93,490 individuals.

Many screen showings which are not a part of either of the regular monthly programs, are given at various times as special events in most of the 92 libraries that comprise the County System. They are a frequent part of the children's annual summer reading clubs. Including those occasions, and counting the regular monthly programs, the library presented a total of 2,750 public film shows last year.

Film circulation for the last fiscal year, which ended June 30, was 2,206, an increase of 834 over the previous year, and many new films were added to the collection, in the previous year when the service was new and the collecting just starting, those purchased were largely travel and general interest films. Last year's additions however, included several outstanding and imaginative productions in the fields of art, music, history, folklore, natural and applied science, recreation, and some very specialized areas of biography and literature.

Feature of the luncheon was awards given to local residents and industries that donated their time and efforts towards making this year's American Cancer Society Crusade one of the most successful in its history.




