


Saxons Trounce Spartans In North, South Contest

The North High Saxons trounced the South High Spartans 39-0.

They have now been scored on 12 times in the past two games while they have failed to score. They have allowed a total of 105 points while they have scored only 20.

After intercepting a Spartan aerial on the first play from scrimmage, the Saxons ripped off 55 yards in 14 plays. Doug Jackson put the first score on the board with a 1-yard plunge.

The Saxons contained the Spartan offense forcing them to punt. The punt rolled dead on the Saxon 45. Following two drives up the middle John Rance swept down the sidelines for a 46 yard touchdown. Bill Cunerty converted to give the Saxons a 13-0 lead.

The Spartans committed a mental error as they let a kickoff roll loose, and the Saxons recovered on the South 14. The Saxons then capitalized as Sam Elliot flipped a 5 yard touchdown to Kent Hiner. The Saxons lead at halftime 19-0.

The Saxons added a third quarter tally as they drove 24 yards in seven plays with Elliot sneaking over for the score. Cunerty added the

conversion and it was 26-0 Saxons.

Three plays later Scott Christianson faded to throw for the Spartans. He fired out into the flat where it was intercepted by Rance who sped downfield for his second touchdown of the game.

Rance got his third tally of the night as Elliot whipped a pass to Hiner. Hiner then lateraled to Rance who streaked down the sidelines then cut in to elude the final Spartan tackler. Cunerty converted to cap a 39-0 victory for the Saxons.
