



David K. Lyman, chairman of the 68th Assembly District Los Angeles County Democratic Central Committee, announced that local Democrats will honor Speaker of the Assembly Jesse M. Unruh by holding a day for him in Torrance on Nov. 22. A tea will be held at the Torrance YWCA at 2320 W. Carson from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m. followed by a reception at the Jump'n Jack restaurant from 6 p.m. until 8 p.m., Lyman stated. The tea will be open to the public and is being organized by a committee composed of Mrs. Dan E. Butcher, Mrs. Rene Dean, Mrs. David K. Lyman, Mrs. Ronald Rudy, Mrs. Leo Salisbury, Mrs. Roger West and Mrs. Robert B. White, according to Lyman. Torrance Democrats, Inc. with Leo Salisbury as president will host the reception at the Jump'n Jack so that community political and business leaders may meet with Mr. Unruh, Lyman stated. "During his term in the legislature Mr. Unruh has built the position of speaker into one of importance and influence. His fight to place leadership of the assembly with the leader of the majority party in the legislature rather than with some outside special interest group has made him a target of criticism for those who would seek to diminish his influence. I hope that the people of Torrance will attend the tea so they can judge for themselves the true worth of an individual who is considered one of the nation's most able legislators," Lyman concluded.

First Aid Class Set

Beginning Wednesday evening, October 30, Torrance Evening High School will again open a class in Basic First Aid. This five week course is offered in cooperation with the American Red Cross and is open to the public. The course provides the necessary techniques in Basic First Aid training required by the State of California for bus drivers in the various school districts, ambulance drivers, scout masters, supervisors of various safety functions, and for organizations who feel they have need for it. It also provides the basic type first aid training needed by persons responsible for civil defense and other functions.

This was a professionally planned conference for the officers, delegates, and sponsors of the business education clubs — Future Business Leaders of America, Distributive Education Clubs of America, and other business-oriented clubs of the high schools in Los Angeles County and nearby counties.

The class will meet each Wednesday evening during the five week course in Room 97 at Torrance High School, 2200 W.
