

Adult Eagle Scout Search Under Way

A call to all adult Eagle Scouts in Southern California has been made by the Los Angeles Area Council, Boy Scouts of America.

Men who earned the Eagle Scout badge when they were scouts are urged to call Hollywood 1-9345.

The "Call of the Eagle" marks the beginning of a new program in local Scouting.

When a man calls HO 1-9345, his name is entered in a permanent directory of all Eagle Scouts who now reside in Southern California. He will receive a special booklet called "Trail of the Eagle." He will also be mailed a card and asked to fill it out, indicating interest in giving leadership to Scouting.

Currently in the Los Angeles Area Council, the Scouting program is being enjoyed by less than 25 percent of the boys of Scout age.

School surveys show that 50 to 75 percent of the boys want to be Scouts. The local Council is eager to expand the character-building program of Scouting to more boys.

It is felt that if men who earned the Eagle Scout badge could be invited to put back into Scouting some of what they got out of it as a boy, the Scout Council would have an increased reservoir of manpower capable of helping reach the boys who want to be Scouts but are not now enjoying the program.

the boys who join Scouting are able to reach the rank of Eagle Scout, which entails earning 21 merit badges, appearing before a Board of Review for personal interview, and securing letters of "recommendation" from Scout leaders, clergymen and others.

A man who earned the Eagle Scout badge is not only a "superior product of Scouting," but probably also is a leader in his business, profession or community. This is the caliber of man needed as a volunteer in Scouting.

It is felt that many men would be willing to give back to Scouting — if only somebody asked them!

The Call of the Eagle is the program by which these men are being asked.

It makes no difference in what part of the country a man received his Eagle Scout badge, as long as he now resides in Southern California.
