HOCKEY ACTION IS HOT AT OLYMPIC ARENA

Spectators witnessed an exciting ice hockey game Saturday, Nov. 2, at the Olympic Ice Arena on Western Ave. between the West Covina Pee Wees and the local Pee Wees, playing under the name of the Olympic Redwings. The game started at 6 p.m. with a good lineup for each team.

The players in this group are all between the ages of seven and 10. The ice was good and the game was fast with both teams engaging in some very professional blocking. The hard-fought battle ended in a 5 to 0 score in favor of West Covina and sportsmanship with a rousing cheer for the other before leaving the ice.

A very welcomed added attraction was Susan Robinson, sister of Redwing goalie Frank Robinson, who volunteered her services as cheer leader for the team. This is the first time the Olympic Minor Hockey Association has ever had a cheer leader and the local fans voiced their enthusiasm long and loud—at times even drowning out referee Jim Burnett's whistle.

This is also the first season any of the teams of the Olympic Minor Hockey Association (OMHA) has engaged in league games. Although organized in 1962, there was much to be accomplished before they were eligible for league competition. With each game, the boys display more skill and confidence which, in turn, reflects the coaching and

training of John Watson (Pee Wees), Bill Ford (Juniors), Bob Edwards and Bill Scanlon (Bantams).

The game played Sunday, Nov. 3, at the Olympic Ice Arena between the Van Nuys Juveniles and the local Juveniles, known as the Olympic Maple Leafs, started off at a fast pace and never let up. The players in this group are between the ages of 14 and 18. In the effort to make goals or prevent the opposing team from making a goal, the action and skill displayed by these players held the attention of the fans.

THINGS TO SEE IN SOUTHLAND

The opening of the 1963-64 Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra season and Veterans' Day observances in Long Beach and San Diego top the list of things to see in the Southland this week. Here is the schedule of activities in the area for the period of Nov. 7 through Nov. 16 as compiled by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

"People of the Valley," an exhibit of textiles and costumes of the 1870's, will be featured at the Los Angeles State and County Arboretum during the month of November at Arcadia.

The Imperial Valley Rodeo and Brawley Cattle Call will be held through Nov. 10. Featured will be a Melodrama Nov. 7 and a public barbecue lunch Nov. 9 and 10. A rodeo will also be staged on the final two days of the event.

The Padua Hills Theatre, Claremont, will present "Bien Venidos a Mexico," a potpourri of songs and unusual dances of Old Mexico, through Nov. 9. "Las Posadas," the traditional Mexican Christmas play, will be presented Nov. 13 through Jan. 4.

The 14th Annual Death Valley 49'ers Encampment will be held in Death Valley National Monument Nov. 7 through 11. Featured will be special breakfasts Nov. 8, 9 and 10, a burro flajjack contest Nov. 9 and dedication of two historical markers, one Nov. 7 and one Nov. 11. Special evening programs will be held daily along with guided tours of the entire Death Valley National Monument.

More than 60 antique collectors will participate in the Hollywood Antiques Show in the Hollywood Paladium Nov. 7. Hours will be 1 to 10 p.m.

Hollywood Park Harness Racing will be held through Nov. 16 in Inglewood.

The Annual Allied Craftsman Exhibit will be held at the La Jolla Art Center through Nov. 10.

The Long Beach Diamond Jubilee Celebrity Ball will be held in the Long Beach Arena at 8:30 p.m. Nov. 15.

The annual Veterans' Day Parade will be held downtown Long Beach at noon, Nov. 10.

In Los Angeles, The Masterworks of Mexican Art will be featured in the County

Museum through Jan., 1964. This is the largest and most comprehensive exhibition ever organized of the history of Mexico art covering over 3,000 years and containing over 2,000 objects. For the last two years, the exhibition has toured most of the major capitols of Europe. Chamber music is provided each Sunday at 3 p.m. in the Museum.

The Character of Korea will be the theme of the exhibit at the Los Angeles City Hall Tower Gallery Art Exhibit through Nov. 27.

The Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra will open its 1963-64 season with Zubin Mehta conducting and Mstislav Rostropovich, cellist, as guest at 8:30 p.m. Nov. 14 in the Philharmonic Auditorium. The same program will be repeated at 2 p.m. Nov. 15 in the Philharmonic.

The Los Angeles Lakers will play San Francisco at 8:30 p.m. Nov. 8, New York at 7:05 p.m. Nov. 10 and Detroit at 8:30 p.m. Nov. 16 in the Sports Arena.

The Los Angeles Blades will play San Francisco Nov. 9 and Seattle Nov. 13 and 14 in the Sports Arena. All will begin at 8 p.m.

UCLA will play Washington at 1:30 p.m. Nov. 16, in the Coliseum.

The Frank Sinatra Invitational Golf Tournament at Palm Springs, will be staged on the Canyon Country Club course Nov. 7 through 11. Leading golfers are scheduled to participate in the event.
