

Nurserymen Recommend Shrubs for Fall Planting

Early Bloom from Camellias and Azaleas

If you doubt the old saying that California's fall is like a second spring, take a look in nurseries this month. You'll likely find blooming specimens of two spring standbys — camellias and azaleas.

According to the California Association of Nurserymen these "spring" beauties can sometimes be found as early as September and always by November with bloom on their branches. Not all varieties, to be sure, but a good many of them such as the azalea, 'Chimes' will break with unseasonal bloom in autumn. And others will take up where these early birds leave off, stretching the season for camellias and azaleas for well over six months of the year.

Among camellias, it's the Sasanqua segment of the family which breaks first with fall bloom, and before they drop their petals, the early Japonica varieties start to show up. These latter are the principal camellias of winter months and are also the dominant varieties in spring, bless them.

But first things first, and since fall belongs to the Sasanqua camellias, let's look at them more closely.

Exactly what makes a Sasanqua variety different from Japonicas? If you look at one in C.A.N. nurseries, you will notice two things right off. First the blooms on Sasanquas are a bit smaller, but nonetheless attractive. Secondly, the framework of the plant is more willowy — more open and less rigid. They seem to be debating whether to stand tip or lie down.

This latter habit makes the Sasanqua a most versatile plant. Since the branch structure is less formal and rigid, you can make it do things a Japonica would never submit to. A Sasanqua can easily be espaliered, for

instance — laid flat against a framework or lattice. Or, if you want to try something farther out, peg the branches down and make a camellia ground cover out of several shrubs. That's one ground cover that will draw attention. An added note of interest about the Sasanquas: they can grow tall as in the Cleopatra and Hinode-Gumo varieties, or low as illustrated by Showa-No-Sakae or White Doves.
