

## Carson Area Road Funds Win Approval

The Board of Supervisors on motion by Supervisor Burton W. Chace this week allocated \$2,500 for improvement of a portion of Santa Fe Ave. near Monroe St.

Los Angeles County Road Department crews will schedule the work in the near future.

The improvement will consist of extending the pavement to join with new curbs and gutters on the east side of the roadway, Chace said.


In approving the allocation, Chace pointed out that Santa Fe Ave. is a County master plan highway carrying an average 12,000 vehicles daily.

"The completed project," Chace said "will improve area drainage, decrease maintenance costs and improve operational efficiency of the arterial highway."

## Christmas Seals Go Out to Beach City Residents

With the mailing of appeal letters to some 1,400,000 families in Los Angeles County, the 57th annual Christmas Seal campaign of the Tuberculosis and Health Association officially opens this week.

William H. Soady, 1511 W. 249th St., Harbor City beach cities area Christmas Seal chairman, said this year's campaign goal has been set at \$875,000 and funds are urgently needed to support the year-round programs of the pioneer voluntary health agency in tuberculosis control and respiratory diseases.

Soady added the traditional Christmas Seal campaign conducted entirely by mail, is the only source of income for the agency. He urged families in Los Angeles County to respond quickly and generously to the campaign.

"More than 1,700 new cases of TB have been reported in our county thus far in 1963," Soady said, "and it is apparent much remains to be done in the fight against TB. Health officials hope to achieve by the year 1970 that point in TB control when the disease no

longer represents a public health menace to our community.

"In addition, progress is being made in research, professional and public education and community service programs in all respiratory diseases. These illnesses represent the fourth leading cause of death in the United States and are first among causes of industrial absenteeism."

Soady said the campaign is now underway and will continue through the holidays. He added residents of his area have been most generous in past years in supporting Christmas Seals and voiced confidence of continued support.



## REALTOR PRESIDENT CHARGES RUMFORD CLOUDING ISSUE

The charge made Wednesday by Assemblyman W. Byron Rumford (D-Berkeley) that the California Real Estate Association is "trying to stir up racial strife" in seeking to end the California Fair Housing Act is "a smoke screen to try to cloud the real issue involved," L. H. Wilson, president of CREA, said today.

"It is Mr. Rumford who seeks to stir up racial strife by threatening that a straightforward ballot proposition could lead to street demonstrations. We have hundreds of ballot propositions in California without planned violence. Just who would stir up such organized terror this time?"

Rumford is the author of A. B. 1240, which makes refusal in California to sell, lease or rent property for

reasons of race, color, creed, religion or national origin punishable under law. He made the accusation at a Los Angeles news conference.

"We and other groups," Wilson continued, "have filed an initiative constitutional amendment with the State Attorney General to give the people of California an opportunity to restore their constitutional freedom of choice in acquiring, using or disposing of their private real property. This is the real issue."

"We believe in giving any American equality of opportunity no matter what his race, creed or color. But we do not believe in giving special privilege to one group over another."

"Nor do we believe that granting special privilege can further the cause that Mr. Rumford is advocating. In the long run it can only HARM THAT CAUSE by setting one group against another."

"Since the Bill of Rights became a part of our constitution, our citizens have had the right to own, use and dispose of real property as they see fit without governmental interference. In California, part of this right has now been taken away."

"The people of California should be able to speak on an issue this grave. To give them that opportunity we have filed an initiative constitutional amendment to guarantee property owners the right to rent, lease or sell their property as they see fit and will soon be circulating petitions to qualify this initiative."

"We want Californians at the next general election to vote on this question: Do they want to give up part of their fundamental property rights, or do they want to restore and protect these rights? That is the real issue. It should be the people's choice," Wilson added.
