
"The Lights of Hanuka" will be presented on Friday evening, December 15th, during religious services at 8:30 p.m.

Advent Mission Set for Teens

Sponsored by the Catholic Youth Organization, an advent mission for teenagers will be conducted at St. Catherine Labour Church, 3864 Redondo Beach Blvd., Sunday through Tuesday, according to Rev. Raymond Tepe, pastor.

Parishes in the area surrounding Torrance, which have been invited to participate include Gardena, Hawthorne, Inglewood, Lawndale El Segundo, Manhattan Beach and Redondo Beach.

The mission will be given by Rev. Edward Soto, assistant at Ascension Church, Los Angeles. It will begin at 7:30 each evening, last one hour, and include a question and answer period.

Subjects will cover teenage problems, vocation, confession, dating, courtship and marriage. While principally for public high school students, the mission will be open to all teenagers non-Catholic as well as Catholic.

A total of 6938 teenagers attended Advent missions throughout the Archdiocese last year. Sixteen missions will be conducted this year.
