



YW Recommends Obscenity Study to City Council

The Youth Welfare Commission of Torrance, marking the beginning of its second year as an advisor agency of city government, has recently recommended that the City of Torrance sponsor a Town Hall meeting on the subject of "Obscene Literature and Juvenile Delinquency—cause and effect."

A motion entertained by Joseph Piatt, commission chairman, to nominate a new chairman for the second year of commission operations was tempted by the members.

Youth Council

In other action the commission began hearings on a proposed "Youth Coordinating Council" recommended by Commissioner Dick Pyle. Students representing the North High School Student Council and Bishop Montgomery High School's senior class were interviewed by the commissioners. The students were invited to attend the meetings, through the offices of Dr. J. H. Hull and the Rev. Joseph Pekarek, to express youth's opinion on the information of a youth group that may help remove the causes of juvenile delinquency.

School counselors, service club officers and fraternal organization representatives will be invited by the Youth Welfare Commission to participate in future discussions on the subject of the "Youth Coordinating Council."

Issue Invitation

In her resolution asking City Council approval of the Town Hall project, Mrs. Earl T. Jordan suggested inviting the other cities of the South Bay area to participate in the program. Her resolution was unanimously adopted by the commission members, and was approved at last night's council meeting.
