THINGS TO SEE IN SOUTHLAND

The poinsettia fields in full bloom near Carlsbad top the list of things to see in the Southland this week. Here is the schedule of activities in the area, as compiled by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

Carlsbad

During the month of December the poinsettia field which line US 101 near this community, will be in full bloom. From this area over 90 per cent of all commercially grown poinsettias in the United States are grown.

Claremont

The Padua Hills Theatre will present "Las Posadas," the traditional Mexican Christmas play, through Jan. 4.

La Jolla

A parade will herald the arrival of Santa Claus to this community the evening of Dec. 6.

The annual Competitive Art Show, featuring paintings and sculpture by California artists, will be featured at the La Jolla Art Center through Dec. 15.

Los Alamitos

The annual fall meeting for quarterhorses will be held at Los Alamitos Race Course through Dec. 21.

Los Angeles

The Masterworks of Mexican Art will be featured in the Los Angeles County Museum through January 1964. This is the largest and most comprehensive exhibition ever organized of the history of Mexican art covering over 3,000 years and containing over 2,000 objects. For the last two years, the exhibition has toured most of the major capitals of Europe.

The Museum will also feature an exhibit titled "The Old Navy," a history of the U. S. Navy in paintings, sketches and watercolors, through Dec. 15. Chamber music is provided each Sunday at 3 p.m. in the Museum.

"Dry Up" Parties Says Council

Supported by special study statistics showing that more than half of all traffic fatalities in December involve drinking drivers, the Greater Los Angeles Chapter of the National Safety Council has appealed to business and industry to "dry up" the Christmas office parties.

Stressing that the organized safety movement is not trying to take the joy out of Christmas office parties but instead is endeavoring to keep Christmas really joyful by helping prevent traffic tragedies, Chapter President J. T. Blalock said:

"Many persons who attend Christmas office parties where liquor is served are confronted with driving to their homes, often many miles away, and the traffic hazards created by drinking are up sharply in the last business day before the observance of Christmas."

"Many people" the safety council head continued, "have the misguided idea that a few drinks will not affect their driving but scientific studies have determined that critical judgment and driving ability are impaired by every drink and each successive drink. People who think a few drinks will not affect their driving are flirting with danger and disaster, not only for themselves but for others."

A photographic essay on roads in the development of civilization will also be featured at the Museum of Science and Industry from Dec. 5 through 26.

The Tower Art Gallery in the Los Angeles City Hall will feature an exhibit of works by members of the California Art Club from Dec. 6 through Jan. 3.

The Los Angeles Blades will play Portland at 8 p.m. Dec. 4 and 6 in the Sports Arena.

The Los Angeles Rams will play the Green Bay Packers at 1:35 p.m. Dec. 7 in the Coliseum.
