Adventists to Break Ground for School

Members of five South Bay Seventh-day Adventist churches will break ground Sunday for the first unit of a \$750,000 school to be built at 4400 West Del Amo Blvd.

Speaker for the ground breaking ceremonies will be Cree Sandefur, Glendale, president of the Southern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists.

Others taking part from the Glendale office will include, Alvin G. Munson, executive secretary; Albert Hamra, treasurer; and John F. Knipschild, educational superintendent. Special guest will be Albert Isen, Torrance mayor.

The new school will serve students from the Gardena, Hawthorne, San Pedro, Redondo Beach, Torrance and Wilmington Adventist Churches. The first unit to be constructed, with a September, 1964 completion date, will be a six class room elementary building.

The second unit will be a small multi-purpose auditorium. Construction on this building is expected to begin soon. The third stage of the building project will be another class room structure. The final unit will include a gymnasium, library and offices.

The first six grades will be housed in the initial building. Completion of each unit will add more grades until the final stage when a full 12-grade school will be in operation. A nine area tract has been purchased for the building project. According to Albion Hoff, pastor of the San Pedro Church and chairman of general arrangements, construction on all four units is expected to be under way within five years.

Building committee members with their responsibilities include: Aldin Young, D.D.S., 3139 West 177th St., Torrance, co-ordinating; Hugh Sterling, 335 West

142nd St., Hawthorne, architectural; Gerald Pierce, 1923 Graham St., Redondo Beach, location; Ozie Emmanuel, 5326 Norton St., Torrance, treasurer; and Mrs. Don Moshos, 2570 Trotters Lane, Rolling Hills, public information.

Plans call for a building superintendent to be hired but most of the construction work will be done on a volunteer basis by members of the five participating churches.

At the present time the Adventist churches in Santa Barbara, Ventura and Los Angeles Counties operate 27 elementary schools, including five of junior high school status.
