Local Realtor Receives Board Liberty Award

Jack Schmidt was presented with the Liberty Award by President Kenneth Peters on behalf of the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors at the recent installation ceremonies. The award first initiated this year goes to the realtor most outstanding in the board's Americanism activities.

In making the presentation Peters said, "Jack Schmidt is the youngest surviving member of World War I. He participated in this Country's first fight for democracy. He lives by the ideals established as a result of that conflict and because he is so strongly militant against the abridging of individual rights I have appointed him to head the committee to outlaw forced housing in this area." In accepting the appointment Schmidt stated, "The California Real Estate Association have filed an initiative constitutional amendment with the States Attorney General to give the people of California an opportunity to restore their constitutional freedom of choice in acquiring, using or disposing of their private real property.

"Since the Bill of Rights became part of the constitution our citizens have had the right to own, use and dispose of real property as they see fit without governmental interference. In California part of this right has been taken away.

"The law recently passed by the State Legislature now makes refusal in California to sell, lease or rent your property for reasons of race, color, creed, religion or national origin punishable by law.

"The people of California should be entitled to speak on this issue. To give them the opportunity we of the California Real Estate Association and the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors will circulate petitions within the next thirty days in Torrance or any other area where people feel it is their constitutional right to vote on this issue.

"We believe in giving any American equality of opportunity no matter what his race, creed or color. But we do not believe in giving special privileges to one group over another.

"Petitions are now being placed in every Real Estate Office in Torrance and the public is invited to stop in and discuss this problem with the realtor and become fully aware of the real issue that he may be free to vote on the question, "Do we as citizens want to give up part of our fundamental rights or do we want to restore and protect these rights."

"It should be the peoples choice," Schmidt concluded, "They will be given this choice by signing the petition."

Diabetes Is Eighth Leading Cause of Death in the U. S.

Diabetes is a more common disorder than is generally suspected and is the eighth leading cause of death in the United States. During the last few years the prevalence of the disease has been increasing, and recent official estimates place the number of diabetics in this country at nearly 3 million, with about half of these individuals unaware that they have the disease.

Diabetes is a chronic metabolic disorder in which there is a diminished ability of the body to change carbohydrates (sugar and starches) into energy. This happens because the body fails to create, or properly utilize, enough insulin. When this happens, sugar piles up in the blood until it begins to pass through the kidneys and into the urine.

Though the disease may occur in younger persons, it usually develops after an individual reaches middle age and afflicts women more frequently than men.

When untreated, diabetes is dangerous and may lead to widespread damage to a number of organs within the body. Unfortunately, the average patient consults a physician only after one or more of the complications which are common to diabetes are well established. As often as not, diabetes is first detected when a patient comes to his doctor because of symptoms resulting from

the complications. The most common complicating disorder is arteriosclerosis or hardening of the arteries, and although this condition is also common among non-diabetics it tends to develop earlier in those individuals who are diabetics. The same is true of eye trouble caused by hemorrhage into the retina.

Some people—especially in the early stages of the disease, have no apparent symptoms whereas other individuals will show evidence of only one or two. The most common signs of the presence of the disease include weakness, a persistent hunger, more than normal thirst, excessive urination, loss of weight, slow healing of cuts, pain in the extremities, drowsiness, and abnormal changes in vision.

There are certain people among whom diabetes appears with greater frequency than in the general population, and these are known to the medical profession as high-risk groups. One group relates to age and includes all individuals over 40. Another relates to obesity and includes any person who is appreciably overweight. Two groups are related to heredity and include the close relatives of diabetics and mothers whose infants weighed 9 pounds or more at birth. Of course it does not follow that all individuals in these groups will become diabetics, but the probability is there and increases with age.

The diagnosis of diabetes is sometimes a complex procedure, but a simple urine test, while not conclusive, is generally recognized as quite efficient in screening and casefinding.

During the Diabetes Detection Week of 1962, some 12,239 persons in Los Angeles were tested for the disease, and 274 of those tested showed sugar in the urine. While this test is not conclusive, it indicates that further testing is advisable in case the disease is present.

Persons with diabetes are more fortunate than people with many other chronic diseases since it can usually be controlled.
