



Largest Float Ever' Entered by Redondo

The largest float ever entered by the City of Redondo Beach will make its appearance in the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena on New Year's Day, it was announced today by City Councilman J. O. Lee Solomon. Float chairman for the sponsoring Redondo Beach Chamber of Commerce, Solomon said the float, entitled "Freedom's Symbols" will be 45 feet in length, 20 feet wide and 12 feet high.

Four giant hats, symbolic of four critical periods of American history and a giant Freedom Torch will rest atop a huge United States Savings Bond. The hats will represent the Puritans, the Colonials, the Frontiersmen and the World War eras. The Savings bond will be decorated with white chrysanthemums, silver-dollar eucalyptus, and red carnation petals. The bond will rest in a garden of 6,000 red roses.

The torch will be covered entirely with silver dollar eucalyptus leaves.

Other flowers used on the giant float include blue cornflowers, daffodils, black croton leaves, and Shredded redwood bark.

Chamber officials said the float will cost \$6500 with the fund raising drive still underway. Donations should be addressed to Float Fund, Redondo Beach Chamber of Commerce, 1708 South Pacific Coast Highway, Redondo Beach.

All the decorating will be accomplished with volunteer labor, it was added.

Miss Redondo Beach and Miss Ensenada will add beauty by riding in flared formals.

A yet unnamed famous personality also is expected to ride on the float, replacing Pat Boone and his family.

Torch will rest atop a huge United States Savings Bond. All decorating on the float will be done by volunteer labor according to chamber officials. A fund raising event is now underway to raise the \$6500 needed to finance the project.

Super Stock Car Races Draw Top Area Drivers

Virtually every top stock car driver in the West will be on hand Sunday, when CJA stages its final super stock car race of 1963 on the 1/4 mile clay oval at Ascot Park in Gardena.

Defending CJA point champion Bill Foster of Newhall has been installed as pre-race favorite, however, he'll be up against such drivers as two-time PRA point champ Walt Price of San Fernando, former NASCAR champ Clem Proctor of Paramount, current CJA point leader Gene Davis of Santa Monica and Cliff Gardener of Culver City.

More than 50 cars are expected to enter the seven event program, which will be climaxed with a 30-lap main event.

A torrid duel is expected between Foster and Price, as a carry-over from the last time they met when Price

was spun out of the race. That same day, Proctor brought out a brand new car and proceeded to set a track record and win the main event.

With the tremendous rivalry and increased speeds, experts figure this to be one of the top stock car events of the year.

Qualifying will begin at 12:30 p.m., with the first race starting at 2 p.m. Ascot Park is located on Vermont Ave. at 183rd St., just off the Harbor Freeway.
