**Winternational Drags Set For Pomona**

Fourth annual Winternationals Championship Drag Races will be held at the Los Angeles County Fairgrounds, Pomona, Calif., Feb. 14, 15 and 16, according to an announcement by Wally Parks, president of the sponsoring National Hot Rod Assn.

It ranks as one of the most important and competitive events of its kind in the nation, second only to the annual NHRA National Championship Drag Races held at Indianapolis each Labor Day Weekend, Parks said.

At last year's Winternationals, the races were viewed by a turnaway crowd of 63,000 persons who watched the vanted dragsters, hot rods, sports cars and stock model cars participate.

A drag race is a test of acceleration from a standing start for one-quarter mile on a straight asphalt track. Cars are timed electronically for both elapsed time and top speed. Contestants are usually paired off according to class, engine size and weight. The loser is eliminated.

Entries are now being accepted at NHRA headquarters, 1171 N. Vermont Ave., Los Angeles.

**Realtors Continue Petition**

The Torrance Lomita Board of Realtors will continue circulating petitions to qualify an initiative constitutional amendment guaranteeing Californians freedom of choice in selling, renting and leasing their property, Kenneth Peters board president said today.

There had been rumors that the effort would be postponed until after the period of national mourning.

**Saddened**  
Peters said, "Our members are saddened by the tragic death of John F. Kennedy. We and the California Real Estate Association have cancelled several meetings originally scheduled during the formal period of mourning requested by president Johnson and Lieutenant Governor Anderson.

**Others Agree**  
"On the initiative, however, CREA and other groups feel, and we agree, that we cannot postpone action without jeopardizing its qualification. California law governing such initiative measures will allow us less than 120 days from now to gather qualified voters signatures, verify them, count and submit them. The law makes no provision for an extension of time because of postponement.

**Responsibility**  
"We feel we have a responsibility to give California voters a chance to vote next year on this vitally important issue.

"In charge of circulating the petitions locally will be Jack Schmidt, a member of our board. Also the recently elected board president Delmar Wright will work very close with the program."
