A SHOPPING GUIDE FOR HOME GARDENERS

Tools of all kinds, yes even a rake, hoe (there are excellent "push" type hoes out now that are easy to use and quite different from the "man with the hoe" type), hedge shears (electrical maybe?), even a set of flower-pots if he or she loves to raise potted plants.

Speaking of potted plants, don't overlook the gift possibilities of dwarf citrus, the bulbs (yep, it's still time for tulips, daffodils, hyacinth, etc.) and the tiny roses.

Dwarf Lemons

Dwarf lemons (either the highly productive Meyer or the higher quality Eureka on dwarf root stock) probably will have some of their in-toxicating bloom on even now — and at Christmas, so planted in 14-by-14-by-12 inch wooden tubs or red-wood boxes they make a knockout gift that just keeps on giving year after year. Equally delightful later on are limes (Bears is the most Tangerines (the Dancy is most prolific, good flavor); oranges, of course. The Kumquat isn't actually a

citrus but it's usually grouped with them because it has the same charm and you can treat it the same. The small, 1 inch, orange fruits can be eaten skin and all or used for making jelly. The beauty of growing these in tubs is, you need not worry about

providing excellent drainage (just make sure the container is well drained!) and you can move them easily to sheltered quarters if the big chill comes.

Tulips

If you're thinking of sending someone tulips, perhaps yourself even, get an odd number of bulbs. Five in an 8 or 10 inch ceramic container of a color calculated to show off the variety you choose is usually an excellent number. Try some of the Cottage tulips, they're just right, not too large, not too small. Or one of the delightful species tulips such as Peppermint or Red Emperor. Hyacinths should be used alone. And don't mix

colors. Their fragrance is an added charm. Incidentally, tulips and hyacinths need chilling in the refrigerator two weeks before planting to get the proper stem height.

What ever gift choice you make for your gardener, a living gift in plant form or tools, you can be sure it will be long remembered.

COUNSELING OFFICES RELOCTAED AT EL CAMINO

Relocation of counseling offices at El Camino College will be accomplished prior to the Christmas recess, W. Holmes Smith, assistant director of student personnel, announced this week.

Persons seeking counseling appointments prior to the spring semester will be directed to temporary counseling facilities in the library building. The change is necessary because of construction currently under way as part of the campus expansion program.

"We hope that our permanent facilities will be completed by June 10 and that we will be in normal operation by the fall of 1964," Smith said.

New Area

The new counseling area will consist of offices for 23 counselors the secretarial staff, assistant director, and for the testing program. Each office will be located on the west wing on the first floor of the Administration Building.

During a school year the counseling staff provides 4,700 day students with half-hour scheduled appointments and counselors are available daily for additional student consultation.

"Our primary function is educational planning and program attention. However, all counselors aid in vocational planning and one member of our staff is a full-time vocational counselor," Smith said.

A psychological counselor is also available to assist with personal or emotional problems.

Evening students have

more than fifty hours a week available to them for counseling and every student enrolling at El Camino has his approved by a counselor during registration.
