

### Things To See In The Southland

The 74th annual tournament of Roses and Rose Bowl football game in Pasadena top the list of things to see in the Southland this week. Here is the schedule of some of the outstanding activities in the area for the period Dec. 26 through Jan. 4 as compiled by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

An estimated 10,000 lights are strung through the 80-foot tall cedar trees along Santa Rosa Ave. from Las Flores to Woodbury Road in Altadena. The lights will be lit through Dec. 31.

Santa Anita's annual winter racing meet will be held through March 10.

The annual Colorado River Catfish Derby will be sponsored by the Palo Verde Valley Chamber of Commerce. Prizes will be awarded for the biggest catfish and bass caught during the derby in the Colorado River, its canals or lagoons.

The Brawley National Horse show will be held Dec. 28 and 29.

During the month of December the poinsettia fields which line US 101 near Carlsbad, will be in full bloom. From this area over 90% of all commercially grown poinsettias in the United States are grown.

The Padua Hills Theatre, Claremont, will present "Las Posadas," the traditional Mexican Christmas play, through Jan. 4.

An exhibit of sculpture, oils and watercolors by artists of the Southwest will be featured in the Hospitality House at Descanso Gardens through Jan. 2.

The International Sailboat and Yacht Show will be staged in the Long Beach Arena from Jan. 3 through 12. Hours will be 4 to 11 p.m. weekdays and noon to 11 p.m. weekends.

#### L.A. AREA

The Masterworks of Mexican Art will be featured in the Los Angeles County Museum through Jan. 5. This is the largest and most comprehensive exhibition ever organized of the history of Mexican art covering over 3,000 years and containing over 2,000 objects. For the last 2 years, the exhibition has toured most of the major capitals of Europe.

The largest exhibition of sculptures and drawings of Gaston Lachaise, French-born American sculptor, ever assembled are on display at the Museum through Jan. 19. Chamber music is provided each Sunday at 3 p.m. in the Museum.

The Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra with Charles Munch as guest conductor will play in concert at 8:30 p.m. Jan. 2 in the Philharmonic Auditorium.

**Observatory Program**  
"Man's Place in the Universe" is the title for the program in Griffith Park Observatory and Planetarium through Dec. 31. The show is held daily, except Monday, at 3 and 8:30 p.m. with extra matinees on weekends and holidays at 1:30 and 4:30 p.m.

A display of creative play equipment, designed to stimulate the child's imagination, will be displayed at the Museum of Science and Industry in Exposition Park through Dec. 29.

The Tower Art Gallery in the Los Angeles City Hall will feature an exhibit of works by members of the California Art Club through Jan. 3.

The Los Angeles Basketball Classic, featuring outstanding college basketball teams, will be played in the Sports Arena Dec. 26 through 28. Games will start at 1:15 and 7 p.m. daily.

The Los Angeles Lakers will play St. Louis Dec. 31 and Boston Jan. 4. Both games are at 8:30 p.m. in the Sports Arena.

The 75th annual Tournament of Roses Parade and Rose Bowl football game will be held Jan. 1 in Pasadena. The parade will begin at 8:45 a.m. Theme for the event will be "Symbols of Freedom."

Members of the San Diego Rowing Club will have their annual New Year's Day swim in San Diego Bay Jan. 1. The swim has been an annual event since 1896.

**Boat Races**  
San Diego Yacht Club will hold its invitational New Year's Day Race in the open water off Point Loma Jan. 1.

Members of the San Diego Speedboat Club will conduct a special program of water ski exhibitions and boating demonstrations on San Diego Bay Jan. 1.

An exhibit of textiles will be featured in the Fine Arts Gallery in Balboa Park Jan. 1 through 31.

Polo games are scheduled for 2:30 p.m. every Sunday at the Santa Barbara Polo Club.

## Surf Notes

Santa Monica's Second Annual Midwinter Surfing Championships will be the largest ever sanctioned by the U. S. Surfing Association according to Richard Samp, program supervisor, from the Santa Monica Recreation Department.

Entries received prior to the deadline totaled some 376 surfers from San Diego to Santa Barbara. The various events will be held Dec. 27 and 28 south of the Santa Monica Pier, from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. Contestants will be checked in at Lifeguard Tower Number 7 at the foot of Vicente adjacent to the surfing area.

Following is a schedule of events; Dec. 26, 27 and 28 men's surfing championships, 18 years or older, freestyle division; women's open surfing championships, freestyle division and boys freestyle surfing championships, 17 years or under.

Additional events include:

National Skim Board Championships, December 26 for men which is open competition; Body Surfing Championships, Dec. 27 for men also open competition; Surf Board Sprint Race, Dec. 28 for men and women with both open divisions; and finally the National Skate Championships, Dec. 28 for men which is open competition.

All preliminaries will be held on Dec. 26 and 27 with finals taking place on Saturday Dec. 28 between 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. for all events.

The surfing championships are co-sponsored by the Santa Monica Swimming Patrons and the Santa Monica Recreation Department in cooperation with the Santa Monica Chamber of Commerce.

Trophies will be awarded to winners at Santa Monica Civic Auditorium Dec. 28 at 8:30 p.m. in conjunction with a Surf-Fair held there.

## Buses from Area to Rose Parade Slated by MTA

Special MTA buses will travel direct to Pasadena New Year's morning for the Rose Parade from throughout the South Bay and Centinela Valley areas.

The service to Marengo and Green Streets in Pasadena for the Tournament of Roses will operate via Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, El Segundo, Westchester, Torrance, Lawndale, Hawthorne, Lennix and Inglewood.

Buses will leave from Catalina Avenue and Avenue I in Redondo Beach at 5:45 a.m.; from Hermosa and Pier Avenues, Hermosa Beach, 5:55 a.m.; from Manhattan Avenue and Manhattan Beach Boulevard, Manhattan Beach, 6:01 a.m.; from Richmond Street and Grand Avenue, El Segundo, 6:12 a.m.; from Manchester Avenue and Sepulveda Boulevard, Westchester, 6:22 a.m.; and from Manchester Avenue and Market Street in Inglewood at 6:30 a.m.

Other buses will depart from Catalina Avenue and Torrance Boulevard, Redondo Beach, 5:45 a.m.; from Hawthorne and Torrance Boulevards, Torrance, 5:54 a.m.; from Hawthorne and Artesia Boulevards, Redondo Beach, 6:07 a.m.; from Hawthorne and Rosecrans Boulevards, Lawndale, 6:12 a.m.; from Hawthorne Boulevards, Lennox, 6:22 a.m.

There will be no stops enroute to Pasadena following the pickup of passengers in Inglewood.
