
## Worshippers Return Home

## Big Classes Forecast in Kindergarten

With marriage rates climbing throughout the nation, the present trend toward smaller kindergarten classes in Torrance may be on the way out. Dr. Louis Kaplan, assistant superintendent of schools for special services, thinks kindergarten enrollments will begin to climb upward again. According to Dr. Kaplan, marriage rates are up on a national state, and local level—reaching the highest level since the early 1950s. California has shown an increase of more than 6 per cent, compared to the 4.8 per cent throughout the nation. The Los Angeles County increased topped both the state and national levels, going up by 7 per cent over last year. The effect of this rising marriage rate, said Dr. Kaplan, will depend greatly on how newly married couples plan to stay in Torrance.


