We managed to get away from our own art gallery last Tuesday and spent a very pleasant afternoon at the new exhibit grounds of the Laguna Beach Festival of Arts. Can't really say how expensive the improvements were... but it put the Festival exhibits out of the carnival class... at least that's what it reminded me of.

The quality has improved tremendously and it is refreshing not to see hundreds of "pretty" little seascapes and little red barn paintings. I heard that this year a committee had been set up for pre-screening of the artists' work... at long last.

THE TENTH ANNUAL All-California Exhibit was as interesting as ever, but as usual, I couldn't agree with the judges. First Award in oils went to Richard Haines for his "Tall Boy" and I really felt that Edgar Ewing's "Billiard Room" should have received the award instead of Honorable Mention.

Most of the work was overpriced... as is par for the course... particularly the small sculptures. "Barley Hill" by Ray Friesz was a breathtaking oil, done in a new approach, combining the realism of an Andrew Wyeth with the "paint-splashing" of Jackson Pollack. This too, was overpriced at \$1,200.

Another painting that caught my eye was an ink and wash drawing or it might have been a watercolor...

Marymount Names New President

Sister M. Raymond McKay, president of Marymount College in New York City, has been named to succeed the late Mother M. du Sacre Coeur, R.S.H.M., as president of Marymount College in Palos Verdes.

Born in Northern Ireland, Sister Raymond came to the United States in 1934 to join the Congregation of the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary, a teaching order founded in 1849.

She held a Doctor of Philosophy degree in economics from Fordham University, and began her career as an administrator in 1944 when she was named headmistress of the Marymount School in New York. Sister Raymond became dean of the Manhattan branch of Marymount College in 1953.

Sister Raymond is scheduled to arrive at the Palos Verdes campus about Sept. 1 to assume her new duties. She will step into her new role Marymount College admits the largest class in its 16-year history on the West Coast.

Exhibition Center Hearing Set By Commission for Next Aug. 3

Coliseum Commissioners have set Aug. 3 as the date for action on a proposed \$6 million Exhibition Center in Exposition Park.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, a member of the Commission and main advocate of the project, points out the center would be built on land already owned by the public with revenue bond financing. "Through use of publicly owned land and by paying off the bonds from receipts and rent, Los Angeles can have the finest exhibit center in the Nation at no cost to the taxpayer," Hahn said.

A thorough feasibility study the Ebasco Services Inc. fully supports Hahn's statement.

THE COLISEUM Commission received Ebasco's report and authorized discussions with bond houses and financing institutions regarding the proposed sale of bonds.

As president of the commission in 1955, Hahn initiated construction of the Sports Arena and obtained legislation from Sacramento to allow financing through revenue bonds.

The bonds were sold the first day they were put on the market. Great public acceptance of the Arena is making possible retirement of the bonds even faster than expected.

Major insurance companies and banks are anxious to buy bonds issued for an Exhibition Center as a "sound investment in the growth of Southern California," Hahn said.

Study is that Exposition Park is not only the most feasible and practical site for an Exhibition Center, but it would also pay for itself in only a few years.

The report states: "The cost estimate of \$6 million for construction of the exhibit center appears realistic if construction were to commence within 18 months."

Total revenue for a typical year of the Exhibition Center would be \$953,150, the report says, with annual operating expenses estimated at \$212,117.

"THIS LEAVES \$741,033 available annually to pay off the bonds," Hahn notes. "They could be paid off in eight years."

"To the homeowner and taxpayer," Hahn said, "that makes a lot more sense than taking up to \$25 million out of their pockets to buy a site from private ownership and build."

Other points covered in the Ebasco Report:

- The underground design (250,000 square feet), combined with the existing Sports Arena, should effectively meet the varied needs of the many prospective users.
- Being underground, there would be no need to invest in costly exterior treatment.
- The site has good present accessibility which should be even better in the future with respect to the city's freeway system.
