
Now is the time for a cool head and a steady hand. But don't let him know how cool and steady you are.

Palos Verdes Bay Club Will Offer Luxury—With A View

Palos Verdes Bay Club, an elaborately designed condominium commanding an 18-acre ocean fronting site on the Palos Verdes Peninsula, is now in an advanced stage of construction.

Resident-owned apartments with up to 1,999 square feet living area, and every suite looking out upon shoreline views, also include recreational facilities centering around an already completed 5,500 square foot clubhouse.

The site is reached from Palos Verdes Drive South by turning to the sea at Sea Mill Drive, one-half mile east of Marineland.

The condominium's 10 buildings of 240 apartment-homes and the separate recreational structure are said to represent a valuation of nearly \$10 million.

Development executive Larry Carlin terms the residential suites "villas," citing the decor and seascape location as being reminiscent of the Mediterranean Riviera's famed residences. Villas are presented in two-

bedroom, two-bath floor plans. Unusual feature is a 32-ft. living room with a 27-ft. wide, ceiling-high wall of glass. Master bedroom suites include an accompanying sitting room, which may be converted into den or study.

Private balconies measure as much as 183 square feet with some plans boasting two terraces. Massive walls of glass, with draw-drapes, are oriented to ocean and coastline views.

The wall-to-wall carpeting throughout includes bathrooms. Entry halls, recessed from wide corridors, dressing areas flanked by wide wardrobes, mirrored wardrobe doors, and all-electric kitchens are other inducements.

Palos Verdes Bay Club apartment villas are offered at purchase prices ranging from \$32,950, with possession upon 10 per cent down payment plus closing costs. The monthly payments include maintenance. Purchaser receives grant deed, with title insured by Title Insurance and Trust Co.

Apartments Now Open In Gardena

Ribbon cutting ceremonies recently were held for the grand opening of Les Montclair apartments, 21 luxury units recently completed at 1635 W. 147th St., Gardena. Gardena Mayor Robert

Firstman officiated at the affair, which was attended by some 400 civic leaders and guests. More than half of the carpeted and soundproofed French New Orleans-styled

apartments were rented during the open house, but there are still 10 two-bedroom units available, according to owner-builder John Donnelly of Bojac Investment Co.

Designed in the "balanced power" concept by Furakawa-Guevara Associates, each unit features built-in gas range and oven, gas-fired forced air furnaces, disposals, natural ash cabinets, continuous filament wall-to-wall carpeting and all-tile baths.

In addition, each apartment has its own sundeck and subterranean parking. Located in Gardena, the apartments are close to schools and shopping centers and within easy access to the Harbor Freeway.

Union Carbide Plant Fills South Vietnam Order

The Union Carbide Co. plant here has filled an order for \$31,684 worth of polyethylene resin compound sold to a firm in South Vietnam through United States foreign aid financing, the Agency for International Development reported today.

Purchase was financed under the commodity import phase of the U. S. economic development program in South Vietnam, which helps provide materials and equipment needed in local industrial and commercial growth. Supplementing the anti-Communist military effort, the AID program in South Viet-

nam aims at applying necessary economic and social measures leading to stability and economic progress.

AID-financed production by American firms currently is at the rate of a billion dollars per year. This means that more than 85 per cent of all AID commodity funds remain in the United States.


