Packaged Foods Are Speedy Entree

A new, quick-to-mix meat loaf recipe is this one for Speedy Meat Loaf, a wonderful variation of a favorite family meat dish.

Cream of mushroom sauce mix and French onions make it possible for you to prepare this entree in a matter of minutes. And the speed doesn't detract from the flavor.

Serve it for dinner, or, when cool, at a picnic. When preparing it for a picnic, bake it in a foil pan so it will be ready-to-travel when baked.

SPEEDY MEAT LOAF

- 1 pkg. Durrkee's Cream of Mushroom Sauce Mix
- 1 cup water
- 1 1/2 lbs. ground round or chuck
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1 can (3 1/2-oz.) French fried onions, crumbled

Add sauce mix to water and bring to boil, stirring constantly. Stir in meat, salt, pepper and onions.

Pack mixture into 9-inch round cake pan and bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Cut in wedge-shaped pieces for serving. Serves 6.

Citation Presented To TUSD

A publication of the Torrance Unified School District has won a citation of excellence in a nationwide school public relations contest.

Torrance Unified School District's entry, "Literature Guide for Torrance Schools," was one of 68 winners selected from more than 700 entries submitted by 249 school districts.

Citations will be announced for "excellence," "outstanding achievement" and "merit" in the September issue of "School Management" magazine which co-sponsored the contest with the School Board Publications Association of Rutgers University.

The purpose of the contest is to encourage better school public relations programs by honoring school districts which demonstrate superior public relations skills by their publications.

Entries were submitted in eight categories: school district periodicals, building campaign literature, annual reports, teacher recruitment brochures, curriculum and guidance projects, staff publications, budget and finance publications, and special purpose publications. Categories were judged in two divisions for districts with an enrollment above and below 4,000.

The judging, which took place in New York City in July, was done by a panel of educators, public relations experts and editors. Entries were judged on the basis of content, appearance, and general effectiveness.

Winners of the fourth annual contest will receive certificates suitable for framing.

New Elementary School to Open

With the opening of the Joseph Arnold Elementary School this September, the Torrance Unified School District will have 34 elementary and four high schools.

Located at 4100 W. 227th St., in the area formerly known as "Walteria Lake," Arnold School expects an enrollment of 500 students. Principal is Ronald J. Hall, former vice-principal of Fern-Greenwood School.

The new school will serve students who formerly attended Seaside Elementary School and Meadow Park School. Seaside Elementary School students who reside between Kathryn Streets and Anza Boulevard north of the Lomita Boulevard extension will go to the new school, as will Meadow Park students living north of 230th Street and west of Ocean Avenue.

In preparation for its first school year, Arnold School is currently receiving shipments of tables, chairs, books and supplies. Grounds are being landscaped and playground equipment is being installed this week.

Dr. Robert Morton, assistant superintendent of personnel has assigned 17 teachers, a school doctor, nurse,

psychologist, speech therapist, custodian and cafeteria worker to the new school.

Included in the faculty will be 11 teachers from other schools in Torrance, two from other districts in California, one from Kansas, one from Illinois, and two from the South.

Classroom assignments by grade level will be made available and posted in front of the Arnold School office the opening day of school, Wednesday, Sept. 16.

Hours for grades 1, 2, and 3 will be 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.; grades 4 through 8 will be 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. New kindergarten students will be notified by mail of their hours.



Meetings Set for Orchestra

Two special meetings have been scheduled for El Camino college students who wish to register for the college community orchestra.

James Mack, newly appointed conductor of the orchestra, said those students wishing to enroll only for orchestra could do so at either meeting. Both meetings will be held in room 17 of the music building at 7 p.m. Sept. 1 and 8.

The orchestra class will hold its regular meetings from 8 to 10 p.m. each Tuesday. The 7 p.m. meetings are for orientation and registration.

Students wishing to enroll for the orchestra should be able to perform music of moderate difficulty on a standard orchestra instrument. Some high school experience is desirable.

Mack said he hoped 50 or 60 students would enroll in the fall semester class. Plans are now being made for a Christmas concert and at least one other concert, he said.

Circulation At Libraries Shows Jump

Total circulation for the nine libraries serving Torrance, Lomita, and the Carson-Dominguez area increased by more than 4,000 over the same period last year, according to William S. Keller, county librarian.

Although some individual libraries in the area showed slight decreases in total circulation, increases at other branches were sufficient to record a net gain for the month.

A slight decrease was recorded throughout Los Angeles County, Gell said.

Total circulation for all nine libraries was 76,463, compared to 72,770 for July, 1963. The five libraries serving Torrance recorded a circulation of 52,066. The largest single figure was recorded at the downtown Torrance library, where 18,027 books were circulated.

Other totals include: Carson, 11,677; Dominguez, 3,248; Villa Carson, 3,606; and Lomita, 5,526.
