Dining on a cliff overlooking the sea and watching ships of the world go by are dual delights at **Marineland Restaurant** on the Palos Verdes peninsula. The view is irresistible and it is no surprise that nearly 50 different food specialties served at Marineland come from the sea.

The variety of oceanfare, however, doesn't obscure the merits of the specialties designed for landlubber tastes. George M. Foster, genial owner and often host at Marineland Restaurant, points out that steaks, chops and chicken dishes are equally popular.

An important facet of the restaurant's food "personality" is the selection of "hors d'oeuvre platters." Naturally they are basically seafood with meaty chunks of shellfish served with varied sauces, making up such cold appetizers as Neptune's Platter and the Tropical Island Platter.

Fourteen of these summer-time treats are available nightly at Marineland Restaurant where you will find dining especially pleasant this time of the year. As a matter of fact, the other night when I dined there, I could hardly tear myself away from the delicious shellfish special — lobster, crab and shrimp prepared in a delicate sauce and served in a basket of crisp Chinese noodles — to say nothing of the super-sized Baba-au-Rum! And facing me through the broad expanse of windows that surround the main dining room at Marineland Restaurant, was a path of silver gleaming on the ocean from the "smiling" man-in-the-moon. A full moon — the sea — beautiful surroundings and the cuisine of Marineland! What more could anyone ask for?
