
Road Work Slated in Carson Area

Eighteen County roads will get a new coat of sealing this week, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn. Nearly half a million square feet of pavement will be sealed during the work.

The following streets will be sealed:

- Moneta Avenue from 223rd to Carson streets.
- 220th Street from Main to Figueroa streets.
- 218th and Flat streets from Caroldale to Moneta avenues.
- Caroldale Avenue from 218th Place to 218th Street.
- Archibald Avenue south of 218th Street.
- 219th Street from Moneta to Kinard avenues.
- Nicolle, Rashdall, and Kinard avenues north of 219th Street.
- Caroldale and Archibald avenues south of Flat Street.
- 222nd Street from Moneta Avenue to Main Street.
- Nicolle and Rashdall avenues north of 222nd Street.
- Kinard Avenue from 222nd to Jay streets.
- Jay Street east of Kinard Avenue.
- Rashall Avenue south of 219th Street.

Supervisor Hahn urged all motorists using the areas to drive with care while the construction projects are under way.



WE ARE trying to spur you on to clean up your own house so that an outraged public doesn't demand that the Government do it." With this statement Senator Thomas J. Dodd (Dem-Conn.) announced the findings of a Senate investigation into violence in current TV programming. The Senator then went on to blast NBC and ABC for failing to reduce violence in new shows and perpetuating the violence of old programs by reshoving them on independent stations. CBS was cited as showing "evident improvement."

One NBC program, "Ride With Terror," was singled out as particularly unsuitable. Senator Dodd called the "Dupont Show of the Week" drama "a thorough lesson in how to mug a man in the subway." NBC-TV programming chief Walter D. Scott justified it as "an unusual social document, a report of the kind of thing that has happened."

Actually Scott's chronology was faulty. The violence was the kind of thing that happened AFTER the showing. Shortly after the program was aired, a similar incident was staged by hoodlums in a New York subway, presenting so-
