

Vehicle Inspection Program Begins in Los Angeles Area

A continuing program of inspecting official motor vehicle pollution control device stations is under way in Los Angeles County, California Highway Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden has announced.

"Funds that became available on July 1 enable the California Highway Patrol to more fully carry out its obligation to assure that anti-smog devices are properly installed and inspected," Crittenden declared. "A staff of


inspection specialists in addition to insuring compliance by the stations with laws and regulations governing their operations, will investigate complaints and recommend appropriate action. Violations by licensed stations and personnel can result in suspension of cancellation of licenses.

"We urge motor vehicle owners who believe crankcase anti-smog devices have been improperly installed on their vehicles to contact their nearest California Highway Patrol office and give us the information we need to conduct an investigation," Crittenden said.

Riding Trails Considered Beside Drainage Channels

Use of flood control channel right-of-way for horseback riding and hiking trails is under study by the County Flood Control District at the request of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Hahn pointed out that when a channel is constructed, an open area (right-of-way) is maintained on either side so that homes will not be built to the edge of the channel.

Carl J. Hoffman, president of the Harbor District Chambers of Commerce, recently suggested to Supervisor Hahn that this area could be used for horseback riding and hiking.


