Summer Lab Proves Value of Reading Aids

Readin', writin' and 'rithin' may have once been taught to the tune of the hickory stick, but come fall it's more likely to be the tune of a tape recorder.

Tape recorders and other electronic innovations have added a new dimension to the teaching of the three Rs.

Used to supplement the classroom work of a teacher, new teaching devices can teach a child who reads a word at a time to read phrases and sentences or an average reader to increase the speed at which he reads.

A SUMMER reading lab was established at Fernwood School to help provide an opportunity to evaluate the new reading program. Much of what was learned will be put to work in the average classroom this fall.

Teachers spent from two to five periods each week with each class. The program was geared to the individual needs of the students. One group, set up before the "controlled reader" watched the light beam scan at rates of up to 500 words per minute. Another group listened to tape recordings. Still other students grouped before small film strip readers which flashed groups of words on a screen for a short second.

A reading accelerator was used by students to help average students increase their reading speed. The student controls the speed of the machine.

YOUNGER students used a variety of reading games to improve their ability to read. Cards and other aids are used to build basic vocabulary for the second grade students.

But even with all the new devices, the classroom teacher has not been replaced. Mrs. Norma Barretta, a fifth grade teacher at Fernwood summarized the program this way: "The regular classroom teacher is the basic ingredient in the reading program. The reading lab is the extra that adds a new dimension to her success."

Quinn Johnston, a Victor teacher who spent last year in England, will remain on the job there for another year.

Names of the two English teachers have not been revealed by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare as yet.
