Increasing Divorce Rate Causes Concern in State

The family is the basic unit of human society, but the breakdown of family units is increasing at such a pace that some drastic legal action may be necessary to slow down the divorce rate. Our California divorce rate is twice the national average, and in a couple of our more populous counties, it is three times that average.

The Assembly Committee on Judiciary, which not long ago held a two-day session to ponder solutions to the divorce problem, was told that the state cannot afford the "snowballing expense of family failure." It was reported that of the 300,000 children being supported by California's aid to needy children program, 40 per cent come from homes broken by divorce, separation, or desertion, and another 40 per cent are born out of wedlock. Only 5 per cent of the total are being aided because of the death of the father.

A professor of family sociology told the committee that the highest divorce rate is in the group married between the ages of 15 and 19. He said the divorce rate is three to four times higher among those married in their teens

than it is among those married in later years.

TEENAGE marriages are the most fertile, he informed the group. In 1962, "child mothers" 12 to 18 years old bore 57,000 babies in California. This was approximately 14 per cent of the total live births in that year. Yet the fact that divorce breaks up more families when the wife is between 20 and 25 than in any other five year period is evidence that young people are marrying too soon, before they are prepared to cope with marital responsibilities, he concluded.

A number of witnesses agreed that one of the handicaps to the study of divorce

is the fact so little specific information is available from official records. The causes for divorce are so frequently hidden behind the cover-all phrase, "extreme cruelty," and the information in divorce papers is so scanty, that worthwhile studies are expensive, slow and difficult. A study of 3,000 divorce, separation, and annulment proceedings filed during 1963 in San Francisco gave only the place of marriage, its duration, and the number of children. One of the few conclusions which could be drawn was that marriages performed in Reno appear to be bigger risks during the first year than those in San Francisco.

New Heart Clinic to Begin Work

A Heart Registry, established at Children's Hospital of Los Angeles for the purpose of improving the diagnosis of inborn heart disorders, has been made possible by a grant from the Los Angeles County Heart Association.

Two major contributors for this Heart service are the "Mr. and Mrs. Club" and the employees of The Fluor Corp. Ltd.

Funds were raised by the "Mr. and Mrs. Club" following the death of Aaron William Smith who suffered from a congenital heart defect. A young relative of one of the Club's members, he died at the age of thirteen.

KNOWN AS the Children's Hospital Heart Registry and sponsored by the Los Angeles County Heart Association, it is the first to be set up on the West Coast.

Dr. Benjamin Landing, head of the Department of Pathology at Children's Hospital, is its director. Assisting with the project are Drs. Donald Fyler, head of the Division of Cardiology, and John Gwinn, Radiologist-in-Chief.

Physicians and other hospitals are invited to participate in the Registry service by contributing heart specimens and medical records of patients who have died from congenital heart disorders. This material will then be evaluated and tabulated at the Registry, so that comprehensive information can be gathered and transmitted rapidly to physicians concerned with congenital heart problems.

This information will lead to improved clinical diagnosis and to improved medical surgical treatment for children.

THE CONNECTION between alcoholism and divorce was explored. Here, it seemed to be a case of which came first, the chicken or the egg. Does the unhappiness of the marriage drive the husband to drink, or does his drinking help break up the marriage?

It was recommended to the committee that mandatory pre-marital counseling be required for all young people who have to get court permission to marry, 18 for boys, 16 for girls. Regret was also expressed that the public schools have decreased their teaching of preparation for marriage and parenthood at a time when marital failure is such a problem. Resumption of that teaching was urged.

Some committee members endorsed the suggestion that the interlocutory period before a divorce becomes final be eliminated. It was said that 90 per cent of all reconciliations take place before this period starts, so the enforced delay actually saves few marriages, if any.


