However, last week the PEN & QUILL started its promotion for their family dinners and it has been interesting to receive several telephone calls from readers who wished to confirm the reasonable prices. It seems some people had the idea that the Pen & Quill is a very expensive restaurant. Eloquent it is, expensive it isn't!

One of the favorite entrees at this charming Manhattan Beach restaurant is roast prime ribs of beef. It is easy to understand this popularity for the slices are carved with a lavish hand, meltingly tender, juicy and full of good meaty flavor. Incidentally, this specialty is accompanied by a creamed sauce, baked potato served with butter or sour cream and chives, and a Viking salad of generous proportions.

The varied menu at the Pen & Quill includes such seafood as King Crab Legs saute which is delivered to the restaurant from a quick-deep-freeze which takes place immediately upon being caught in Alaskan waters.
