

Principals Begin Work In August

School doors in Torrance re-opened recently when 37 principals reported to their offices at 33 elementary and four high schools to begin preparations for the 1964-65 school year.

Tackling the job for the first time was Ronald J. Hall, principal of the only new school to open this fall, the Joseph Arnold Elementary School, 3100 227th St.

Although classes do not get underway until Wednesday, Sept. 16, teachers will be on the job ahead of time, with new teachers reporting to school Thursday, Sept. 10, and all other teachers returning Monday, Sept. 14.

IN ORIENTATION sessions, new teachers will meet their principals at their assigned schools, tour the district Educational Materials Building, and attend a luncheon in their honor. Hosting the welcome luncheon set for noon Friday at the South High School cafeteria, will be the Torrance Education Association.

When the rest of the teachers arrive on Monday they will get ready for the start of classes. At 10:30 a.m. Monday they will hear a talk by Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, at the South High School gymnasium. A breakfast for employees completing 10 years of service in the district will be served at South High School cafeteria at 8 a.m. Tuesday.

GUESTS AT the Monday morning session will include: Mayor Albert Ison; City Manager Edward Ferraro; Glenn Pfeil and Robert Curry, newspaper publishers; Garth Belknap, president, Torrance Education Association; J. Walker Owens, manager, Torrance Chamber of Commerce; Fred Mill, moderator, Torrance Educational Advisory Committee; Mrs. James Orr, president, Torrance Council, Parent-Teachers Associations; Albert Charles, Bert Lynn, William Hanson, Mrs. Kenneth Watts, and Dr. Kurt Shery, members of the Board of Education, and Rev. Clifford Tierney of the South Bay Church of God, president of the Torrance Ministerial Association, who will deliver the invocation.

Other special events scheduled before classes begin include a pot-luck supper for teachers at West High, a luncheon for new teachers at North High, and a tea for faculty members of Torrance High School to be held at the home of Dr. Carl Ahee, Sunday, Sept. 13. A luncheon for new teachers at Torrance High will be given by TEA-THS members on Monday. Plans for South High School are nearing completion.

PTA members at South High School will give a luncheon for all school employees Monday. North High and Torrance High employees will be guests of their PTAs at luncheon Tuesday.

An estimated 32,000 students will return to classes when school officially opens Wednesday.

Torrance Unified School District foreign language teachers recently completed a two-week workshop on audio-visual techniques at Torrance High School.


The purpose of the workshop was to develop materials and tape recordings in French, German and Spanish for use in teaching language classes this fall.
