Manuscript Group Will Hear Writer

Renee Taylor, world traveler and author of the best-seller "Hunza Land," will speak to members of the Southwest Manuscripters at a meeting Friday evening at 8 o'clock.

Miss Taylor was the first woman ever permitted to enter Hunza Land, the original Shangri-La. Her story of the land which has no poverty, no police and no jails has created world-wide interest. A documentary film in color, based on the story of the Hunza people, was completed in 1962.

She will discuss "The Creative Approach to Writing" during her appearance before the group. The meeting will be held in Clark Stadium, 861 Valley Drive, Hermosa Beach. Coffee will be served following the meeting.

Easements for the Richmond Oil Corp. and Chevron Hills Pipeline Co. were approved on the recommendation of District Engineer M. E. Salisbury.

No funds were involved in the transactions, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace. The easements are located at the channel crossing with Carson Street.


