Tanner Has Eye Toward Fourth Win

Sammy Tanner, Long Beach's famed "Flying Flea" of motorcycle racing, will be aiming his BSA machine for a fourth straight sweep of main-event and trophy dash honors Friday night at Ascot Park when the AMA flat track season moves into its seventh record breaking month. It's the home stretch of the season now, and all the interest among the two-wheeling railbirds centers around the fight little Sammy is making to catch Elliott Schultz and win his second straight Ascot Park championship.

Schultz, the Royal Enfield mounted South Gate kid, built up a tremendous lead early in the season, but his once insurmountable advantage has been reduced to 443 points by Tanner. The daylight TT steeplechase season opens at Ascot on Sunday afternoon, with many of the popular riders from last weekend's national championships to take part. The first race will start at 2:30 with qualifying and practice laps starting at 1. More than 150 riders are expected.

Friday night's races, directed by J. C. Agajanian, start at 8:30 with qualifying at 7. The daylight TT steeplechase season opens at Ascot on Sunday afternoon, with many of the popular riders from last weekend's national championships to take part. The first race will start at 2:30 with qualifying and practice laps starting at 1. More than 150 riders are expected.

SAMMY HAS been the hot rider at Ascot since capturing two Grand National races, eight and 50 miles, and now has won nine "mains." 2:30 with qualifying and Schultz still leads with 13 victories and at one time had a streak of nine in a row, all since stopped by Tanner.

Hawks Surprise San Diego Team

With impressive wins against San Diego City College and Orange Coast Junior College, the Harbor College Seahawks will open their home season Saturday evening at Casey Field. The Seahawks will host the Comets from Palomar College in a game slated for 8 o'clock. Dual hopes of a Western State Conference title and a shot at the Junior Rose Bowl have swelled for the Harbor gridders as they prepare for their home season. The Hawks travelled to the Border City last week and came home with a 30-16 win.

WITH SAN Diego expecting an aerial blitz, quarterback John Blakemore and halfback Bobby Brooks stayed on the ground and for most of the game. Blakemore ran for one TD, passed to end Steve Cox for a second score, and sent Brooks through the line for a third six-pointer. The defensive unit got into the scoring act when Dave Baekes blocked a San Diego punt in the fourth quarter and came up with the ball in the end zone. The Seahawks left the field at halftime with the score knotted 8-8 and came back with a scoring show in the

final 30 minutes of play. PALOMAR, suffering from a one-sided loss to Harbor last year, has been pointing toward the encounter with revenge uppermost in the mind of every player. Last week, the Comets lost a 20-7 decision to San Bernardino Valley College. In two scrimmages with Orange Coast and Cal Poly of Pomona, the Comets have held their own—due largely to a strong offensive unit and the sharp passing of signal caller Ed Stuart.

Penny Wins Main Event

Jim Penny of Los Angeles grabbed the lead with 10 laps to go Sunday and went on to win his first jalopy stock car main event at Ascot Park. Leon Garrett of Redondo Beach was runner-up in the 25-lap main event on the California Auto Racing program while Chuck Becker Jr. of San Bernardino finished third. Willie Kimbrough of Gardena, still seeking his first CAR main event win of the year, enjoyed his best outing of the season—winning both an eight-lap heat race and the 15-lap semmain. CAR will take a racing holiday this Sunday with the next program on Oct. 11 featuring hot rods and jalopy stocks on the quarter-mile course.
