### Varied Reasons Given for Leaving School Positions

Why do school employees quit their jobs? Reasons range from "inconvenient location" to "professional advancement," says Dr. Robert Morton, assistant superintendent of personnel of the Torrance Unified School District.

According to a report compiled this week by the district about 16 out of every 100 non-teaching school employees left their jobs during the last three years. During the same period teacher turnover dropped from 14.7 per cent to 11 per cent.

Of the 91 employees leaving service, 17 persons gave "inconvenient locations" as the prime factor in their decision and 17 left by "mutual agreement", while 13 persons decided to enter other business.

HEALTH reasons caused 10 persons to hand in their resignations, and eight persons accepted similar employment elsewhere. Home responsibilities took seven persons away from their jobs, while death claimed four. Three persons advanced professionally, and a similar number either retired, completed their assignment or abandoned their position. Two left to further their education. Maternity and leave of absence each accounted for a solitary resignation.
