Christ the King Church To Build New Sanctuary

Ceremonies signaling the start of construction of a new sanctuary for Christ the King Lutheran Church were held last Sunday following the morning worship service.

The Rev. Elmer E. Christiansen, pastor of the church, officiated at the brief ceremonies. Others who were present for the event included:

Missionary Week Set By Baptists

The annual missionary conference of the First Baptist Church of Torrance will be held Oct. 18, 21, and 25, according to the Rev. Robert H. Coburn, pastor. All members of the community are invited to attend the special events.

The Rev. William J. Roberts, vice president-secretary of the Far East Broadcasting Co. and one of its original founders, will speak at the Oct. 18 services at 9:15 and 10:35 a.m. The broadcasting agency, which is interdenominational and non-commercial, operates 15 radio stations in Manila and Okinawa and programs are sent to three-fourths of the world's population.

Member of the Overseas Crusades missionary group to Formosa, Hans Wilhelm will speak at the 7 p.m. service Oct. 18. The son of missionaries to China, Wilhelm joined the Hitler Youth Movement when living with his parents in Japanese-occupied Shanghai. He will tell of his subsequent conversion to Christianity.

Dr. Arthur Mouw, missionary statesman, will conduct services Oct. 25. Dr. and Mrs. Mouw were pioneer missionaries to Boreno.

In addition to the guest speakers, the church foyer will be divided into eight decorated areas displaying articles of interest from the many missionary endeavors supported by the church. This year the First Baptist Church will direct approximately \$20 thousand to missionary work.

Dale Anderson, president of the congregation; Warren Bachmann, building committee chairman; Elain Hanson, president of the American Lutheran Church Women; Patti David, president of the Knights' youth group, and Lawrence Stephenson, original owner of the site.

Construction of the sanctuary is the fourth major building project the church has launched since its organization in 1955. The church, located at 2706 W. 182nd St., now has 800 members.

The sanctuary, to be built at a cost of \$360,000, was designed by architect Culver Heaton. It will be completed next summer. Bjerke-Nicholson Co. of Gardena is general contractor.

More than 400 members of the congregation witnessed the ceremonies. The Rev. Christiansen said the ceremony marked "another important phase in the history of Christ the King."

The new sanctuary will seat 694 persons for worship and accommodate a 95-voice choir. A new pipe organ will be installed as part of the expansion program.






