THE ELABORATE wicker buggy of this period was ordered by a wealthy miner for his baby daughter. The doll wears a beautiful hand-made dress, bonnet, and cap. The exhibit will be on display through Oct. 27 with hours 9 a. m. to 4 p. m. Mondays through Thursdays and 9 a. m. to 6 p. m. Fridays.
