The American Broadcasting Company now has enough branches of the armed forces to declare a war of its own.

The ABC Infantry is working its way through Western Europe in "Combat" Tuesday nights. ABC's Navy is waging war in the Pacific in "McHale's Navy" on Tuesdays and in "Broadside" on Sundays. The ABC Air Force is in the sky over France and Germany on Friday with "12 o'Clock High" and has a reserve wing in training Mondays in "No Time for Sergeants."

This means that ABC is now fighting on all fronts four night a week for a total of three and a half hours. And it's NBC's David Sarnoff who's a brigadier general—ABC's Leonard Goldenson is still a lousy civilian.

I HOPE the FCC will appeal to the Pentagon regarding this oversight. We don't want to offend a foreign power.

"12 o'Clock High," one of ABC's most ambitious new hour-long shows, is based on the best seller and the movie about the 918th Bombardment Group of the 8th Air Force stationed in England during World War II. The opening episode shaped up as a typical Air Force drama about the coward who turns hero. It is essential that the chap be the last one in a brave family of warriors, and this was one—a West Pointer.

Inasmuch as customarily film footage of bombardiers in action is confined to bombs falling, cockpit close-ups and pilots frozen over their sticks, most of the dramas in this series will take place on the ground.

ROBERT LANSING will be regularly starred as the Brigadier General Savage. Judging from the opener, the character is well named. It is his job to harden up his crews, but it is difficult to determine where the psychiatry ends and the sadism begins.

"Broadside" is so obviously a copy of "McHale's Navy" that it doesn't need comment. Joe Flynn and Tim Conway from the latter series even appeared to bolster the opening episode of "Broadside."

If the vulgarity in the two-way title has escaped you momentarily, this show is about WAVES. Kathy Nolan is their leader and they are assigned to a supply depot in the Pacific commanded by Edward Andrews. The opening episode did not approach McHale in humor perhaps because there is something unnatural about women in uniform that stands in the way of hearty laughter.

MISS NOLAN is shapely and it's good to see her out of "The Real McCoys" after five years of service with that outfit. Andrews has been playing this kind of role for a decade.

"No Time for Sergeants" must be familiar to everyone in the land in one form or another because the original GI novel has been re-made more times than a movie star's nose. This time it's television with newcomer Sammy Jackson in the role which introduced Andy Griffith more than a decade ago.

If you like to watch top sergeants take pratfalls and see a hillbilly bamboozle his way through the Air Force, this is for you. It's "Billy Budd" without the court-martial.


