County Crossing Guards Will Remain on the Job

Efforts to remove crossing guards at 25 intersections in Los Angeles County were blocked this week when the board of Supervisors turned down recommendations by the School Crossing Guard Advisory Committee.

On motion of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, the board refused to dismiss guards at 25 intersections which have traffic signals. The effect of the action is to maintain crossing guards at all intersections which now have guards until June, 1965.

"The life of our children is paramount, and we must protect them," Hahn said. "The work of crossing guards a few hours a day is essential to protect our youngsters on busy streets."

THE BOARD's action followed preparatory steps by Hahn on Sept. 8 when removal of the crossing guards was to become effective. At that time Hahn asked that the guards be retained for at least 30 days giving time for further study and recommendations.

Supervisors also unanimously approved Hahn's motion to designate the County's Highway Safety Commission as an appeal board to investigate cases in which parents' groups had been turned down in requests for crossing guards at specific locations by the Crossing Guard Advisory Committee.

Hahn noted that one of the Crossing Guard Advisory Committee's standards for posting a crossing guard at a signalized intersection was that there be at least 75 cars making right turns in a 15-minute period.

"THAT WOULD be five cars turning right a minute, one every 12 seconds," Hahn said. "There are very few intersections in the County that could meet that requirement, but from a common sense approach there are many intersections where crossing guards are needed."

The Supervisor called for more discretion and judgment in handling crossing guard requests above the current practice of just looking at statistics.

Within the Second Supervisorial District represented by Hahn, there are 37 intersections where crossing guards currently are on duty.

day evening, the officers said they would not have signed the resignations without the threat of prosecution.

Police Chief Walter H. Koenig testified to the commission that he at no time told the three men the case would not be presented to the district attorney for evaluation.

"I'm interested in seeing that our officers don't put people in jail on framed-up charges," Koenig said, "and the best way to do that is to remove them from a position of trust and responsibility."

Under questioning, Koenig said he did not fire the men because it was routine practice in such cases to seek a resignation first, and fire the men if they refused. Koenig said he felt his action "was in the best interest of the men and the department."

The Civil Service Commission voted to hold the decision pending a ruling from the city attorney's office on whether the men could demand back pay if reinstated.
