Garden Checklist

1. Plant ground covers this month or next so they can establish themselves during winter and be ready for good new growth in spring.
2. Be sure chrysanthemums are staked to prevent their being bent and blown over by early winds and rains.
3. If you want an exotic touch in the window this winter, try a potted orchid. When you select one, make sure it will bloom during the winter months. Your nurseryman can help you select one.
4. Plant bird of paradise in a warm, sheltered area this month and enjoy its fall to spring bloom.
5. Plant plenty of spring-blooming bulbs in pots and other containers to provide your garden with portable color.
