Coach John Trantham, expressing doubt about some of the starting assignments for the Torrance varsity football team Friday night, finally listed Jim Crockett for the quarterback position and is sticking with Greg Barrett at halfback and big Brian Olson at fullback.

The running of these gentlemen offers the most hope for the Tartars in their Pioneer League test against West High at the Torrance Stadium. They have failed to win in five games this season. Crockett took over at QB after Terry Tiedman came down with the flu. Jeff Tonkel fills the gap defensively, leaving Crockett time to learn new plays during the interim period.

Torrance's winged offense has Doug Kelsey at the wingback spot.

The Tartar line is composed of Roy Gilstrap at center, Bill Everett and Norman Drey at guard, Paul Newhouse and Doug Woodward at tackle, and Lanny Languis and Barry Garribrant at end.

Except for Tiedman, Coach Trantham reports his club is in the best physical shape of the season.

The Tartars, whose Pioneer League opposition figures tough from wire-to-wire, got by their first customer, Lawndale, without disturbing the big Red Cardinals. The score was 38-6.

Trantham cannot picture anyone standing in the way of a Lawndale pennant, but he cautions, "Anything can happen in football."

On this basis the young coach expects the Torrance-West game to go to the team wanting to win it the most. Early week drills indicate a spirit of anxiety for Torrance.

The game will be played right there, on the same field the Tartars have been working out on all week.

### Beat St. John Vianney Knights Battle St. Monica's

After beating St. John Vianney, 19-13, in the final 26 seconds Saturday, the Bishop Montgomery Knights invade Santa Monica's Corsair Field this Friday to meet its second Camino Real opponent, St. Monica's.

The Torrance boys tallied a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns against Vianney at Rancho La Cienega. The first half score was 7-7. Raymond Moreau tallied in the first six minutes from the 12 yard line. Bernie Fox set up the touchdown by recovering a fumble on the Vianney 49 yard line on the second play of the game.

Quarterback Danny Graham put the Knights ahead for keeps in the final period when he ran out of the cup for 26 yards to the 2 yard marker and later scored himself.

After the losers tied the count again at 13-11, Montgomery drove 60 yards in the final two minutes. Graham completed passes to John Pleck and Bob Comstock for 30 yards in the drive. St. Monica's, a pre-season contender, was knocked off by Crespi last week, 34-6.

### Non-Conference Game for Tribe

Taking a break from Metropolitan Conference action, the El Camino College Warriors travel to San Diego Saturday to take on San Diego Mesa College in a 1:30 p.m. encounter at Balboa Stadium.

The Warriors go into the non-conference tilt with an overall four wins and one defeat and a 2-1 conference mark.

The game will provide a tune-up for the Warriors before facing Long Beach, Bakersfield and Valley.

Warrior Coach Ken Swearingen will send his charges against Mesa at full backfield strength now that quarterback Pat Pagett and fullback Daryl Wilson are in top physical condition again.

In the 35-0 win over East Los Angeles last week, Pagett hit on 5 of 7 passes for 79 yards and a touchdown.

Game climax for El Camino was the 73-yard touchdown runback of an intercepted pass by halfback Phil Pomeroy.

West High invades the Torrance High Stadium Friday evening for a football engagement that shows every indication of being a real "Game-of-the-Week."

The Warriors are not only meeting their second Pioneer League foe of the season—they're up against a crosstown rival—and that always means a "big game." The Tartars sport a 0-5 record, while West carries a 2-3 record into the fray. Both teams are winless in league competition.

Senior Dennis Dodd has drawn the starting quarterback assignment from head Warrior coach Bill Parton. Keeping Dodd company in the backfield will be Fred Schwanbeck at right half, Jim Barnes at left half, and Dave LaRoche at fullback.

Line coach Max Lomas tagger John Cochran and Gary Lloyd for the starting roles at end, while Tom Geary and Jim Sonju will be in the tackle slots. Sonju is returning to action after two weeks off—some of it spent in the hospital.

Completing the line will be Scott Steele and Alan Coward at the guard positions and Jeff Barden at the center spot.

With the Pioneer League race just taking shape, the outcome of the game could be the key for the remaining three weeks of competition. West, bested by Lennox last week, faces Lawndale, Aviation, and El Segundo in that order after the invasion of the Tartar's domain.

Meanwhile, Coach Fred Peterson's unbeaten Bees will meet the Torrance Bee squad Friday afternoon at West High and the Warrior Cees travel to Torrance Thursday afternoon.

### South Offers 'Equal Time' To Hawthorne
