Fifth Setback

South Beaten By Hawthorne

When the football season began back in September South High won a 19-18 squeaker from El Segundo.

The fortunes of football have changed considerably since then.

South succumbed on the gridiron for the fifth straight time Friday night in a 26-0 rout to Hawthorne.

El Segundo, meanwhile, heads the Pioneer League with a 2-0 mark.

The Hawthorne victory put the Cougars in the win column for the first time in Bay League action. A week ago

they were toppled by Palos Verdes, 13-7.

South's Bay League log shows a 19-6 loss to Santa Monica coupled with the setback to Hawthorne.

The Spartans' only penetration at Hawthorne came in the early fourth quarter as they moved the ball 45 yards to within 22 yards of a touchdown.

Hawthorne ran for three touchdowns and capped the evening's activities with a 27 yard touchdown pass from Wayne Bryan to Mike Fletcher.

Elsewhere around the circuit Redondo and Santa Monica came up with a 14-14 tie and Palos Verdes knocked over Mira Costa.

Knights Notch Victory

The opening date for individuals and teams to begin basketball practice is Monday, according to Elmer "Red" Moon, adult athletics supervisor for the city department.
