Realty Board Office Expanding

Expanding real estate activity in the Torrance area has necessitated an expansion of the office building owned and occupied by the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors, according to Dell Wright, Board president. Now under construction at the Board of Realtors office building at 22835 S. Arlington Ave. is an addition to the front portion of the structure. The addition will add 900 square feet to the building, and will result in more than 6000 square feet for Board functions, Wright said. General contractor for the \$20,000 addition is Norman C. Zentill, of Manhattan Beach. He is working from plans drawn by Architect Earl R. Mason, A.I.A., Redondo Beach. The additional front area now under construction will provide space for offices and secretarial work area, and an inner atrium. Exterior facade will be of Norma Brick and will utilize modular panels to contribute to the building's esthetic values, it was announced. Growth in the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors' services and functions are illustrated by the fact that an administrative staff of 12 persons serve 1100 Board members and 500 to 500 listings on the Board's multiple listing board each month. The expansion project completes a Board building program which was begun in 1953.

\$318,000 for Widening Of Sepulveda

A \$318,000 contract for improvement of Sepulveda Blvd. from Normandie to Vermont Aves. was awarded this week to Osborn Bros. of Los Angeles. The contract — \$318,067.78 — calls for widening of Sepulveda for 1.22 miles to 100 foot roadway of four lanes. Work will probably start Nov. 15. No completion date was set. The contract also calls for installation of a big storm drain south of Sepulveda, widening of Vermont to a 30-foot paved roadway 2,000 feet south of the intersection. Similar improvement will be made at the Normandie intersection. The road work is part of the master highway plan to make Sepulveda a major arterial east-west highway.
