Auto sales continued to boom in September, when the 1965 model year officially began, and some experts already are talking about another record sales year, in spite of the General Motors strike.

The unabated demand for new cars is, however, creating a serious problem for cities, towns and hamlets all over the country—the problem of disposing of abandoned automobiles, left on streets and in empty lots. In one upstate New York county some 6,000 abandoned cars were counted recently.

Why not sell them for junk? The answer is that scrap dealers no longer are the primary source of basic materials for steel mills. Changing steel-making methods are destroying the traditional reliance on scrap dealers, thereby erasing the market for junk cars.

So serious is the problem in New York that the state has hired an expert to find a solution. His answers will be ready in 1965, but meanwhile he has suggested establishment of industrial parks as a central point for collection and disposal of abandoned cars.

SAFER OPERATING rooms—Hospitals are being armed with new aids in prevention of operating room fires and in fighting the ever-present threat of staph infections. A scientifically formulated floor

wax designed to dissipate static electricity and thus reduce danger of fire or shock has been developed by researchers of the Penetone Division of Amerace Corp. The new wax guarantees the conductivity of conductive floor coverings, the Tenafly, N. J. company says.

In the area of hospital cleanliness, Penetone has introduced PC-6, a germicidal cleaner said to be effective against a wide range of bacteria and fungi. It is termed highly toxic to Gram-negative and Gram-positive microorganisms, and especially useful in minimizing the incidence of infections of staphylococcus aureus, the terrible "golden villain" that has been known to hit hard even spotlessly clean hospitals.

THAT'S GOLD—The question of paying off the debt of the United States by taking gold from the sea came up recently at an international meeting of mineral processing experts honoring the 100th anniversary of the Columbia University School of Engineering and Applied Science.

Although as recently as 1956 it had been estimated that one cubic mile of salt

water contains gold worth \$20 million, it is more accurately known today that the actual gold in a cubic mile of sea water is worth only \$20,000. At that rate, according to Prof. Elmer W. Pehrson of Columbia, the cost of mining gold in the sea would outstrip the returns.

But there are plenty of other materials in the sea more easily mined, such as cobalt, manganese, nickel and copper, and the mining industry is anticipating development of an undersea mining industry before many more years go by. Professor Pehrson has pointed out one barrier that will have to be crossed: international agreements. But he said such agreement probably will come whenever economic contingencies justify sea mining.

SCIENCE NEWS—Medical science has a word of cheer for older people. The aches, pains and other minor, and sometimes even major, physical annoyances of later years should not be blamed solely on the calendar. The advice of medical men is to wait before blaming "old age" for whatever seems to be wrong

and first seek medical attention.

... Book thievery plagues libraries everywhere but a new weapon has been created for the fight against such theft. A self-taught engineer has developed a system wherein a magnetized metal strip hidden in the book activates a solenoid to lock the exit door and, simultaneously, warn the librarian when a theft is tried. When a book is properly signed for, the strip behaves because it is demagnetized briefly for its trip through the door... John Hopkins Hospital researchers seeking to learn the exact functions of the inner ear have found that cats can be taught to distinguish between words.
